- 1 Designating the week of May 1 through 7, 2005, as "Charcot-
- 2 Marie-Tooth Association Awareness Week in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Charcot-Marie-Tooth (CMT) is the most common
- 4 inherited neurological disorder, affecting approximately 150,000
- 5 persons in the United States; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Charcot-Marie-Tooth Association (CMTA) in
- 7 Chester, Pennsylvania, has educated and served this Commonwealth
- 8 for more than 20 years; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While there is no cure for CMT, physical therapy
- 10 improves the muscle strength and endurance of persons with CMT;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, CMTA is leading the charge for educational programs
- 13 dedicated to training doctors at medical colleges in this
- 14 Commonwealth to identify and treat CMT symptoms; therefore be it
