AN ACT

Amending the act of June 28, 1935 (P.L.477, No.193), entitled, 1 as amended, "An act providing for the payment of the salary, 2 3 medical and hospital expenses of members of the State Police 4 Force, of the enforcement officers and investigators employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, and the parole 5 б agents, enforcement officers and investigators of the 7 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, Capitol Police 8 officers, correction officers employed by the Department of Corrections whose principal duty is the care, custody and 9 10 control of inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by 11 the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of 12 Corrections whose principal duty is the care, custody, and 13 control of the criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of 14 the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the 15 enforcement of the drug laws of the Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty 16 17 is the enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, members of the Delaware River Port Authority Police and of 18 19 policemen, firemen and park guards by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port Authority, counties, 20 21 cities, boroughs, towns and townships, who are injured or 22 contract certain diseases in the performance of their duty; 23 and providing that absence during such injury shall not reduce any usual sick leave period," extending the payment of 24 25 the salary, medical and hospital expenses to sheriffs and 26 deputy sheriffs under certain circumstances.

27 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

28 hereby enacts as follows:

29 Section 1. The title and section 1 of the act of June 28,

1935 (P.L.477, No.193), referred to as the Enforcement Officer
 Disability Benefits Law, amended December 19, 1996 (P.L.1438,
 No.183), are amended to read:

5 Providing for the payment of the salary, medical and hospital 6 expenses of members of the State Police Force, of the 7 enforcement officers and investigators employed by the 8 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, and the parole agents, 9 enforcement officers and investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, Capitol Police officers, 10 11 correction officers employed by the Department of Corrections 12 whose principal duty is the care, custody and control of 13 inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by the 14 Department of Public Welfare and the Department of 15 Corrections whose principal duty is the care, custody, and 16 control of the criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of 17 the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the 18 enforcement of the drug laws of the Commonwealth, special 19 agents of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty 20 is the enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, 21 members of the Delaware River Port Authority Police and of 22 policemen, firemen and park guards by the Commonwealth of 23 Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port Authority, counties, 24 cities, boroughs, towns and townships, and sheriffs and 25 deputy sheriffs who are injured or contract certain diseases 26 in the performance of their duty; and providing that absence 27 during such injury shall not reduce any usual sick leave 28 period.

29 Section 1. (a) Be it enacted, &c., That any member of the 30 State Police Force, any enforcement officer or investigator 20050S0243B0244 - 2 -

employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, and the 1 parole agents, enforcement officers and investigators of the 2 3 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, Capitol Police 4 officers, correction officers employed by the Department of 5 Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, custody and control of inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by the 6 Department of Public Welfare and the Department of Corrections, 7 whose principal duty is the care, custody, and control of the 8 9 criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of the Office of 10 Attorney General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the 11 drug laws of the Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the 12 13 criminal laws of the Commonwealth, any member of the Delaware 14 River Port Authority Police [or], any policeman, fireman or park 15 guard of any county, city, borough, town or township, or any 16 sheriff or deputy sheriff who is injured in the performance of 17 his duties including, in the case of firemen, duty as special 18 fire police, and by reason thereof is temporarily incapacitated from performing his duties, shall be paid by the Commonwealth of 19 20 Pennsylvania if a member of the State Police Force or an 21 enforcement officer or investigator employed by the Pennsylvania 22 Liquor Control Board or the parole agents, enforcement officers and investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and 23 Parole, Capitol Police officers, correction officers employed by 24 25 the Department of Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, 26 custody and control of inmates, psychiatric security aides 27 employed by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department 28 of Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, custody, and 29 control of the criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of the 30 Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the 20050S0243B0244 - 3 -

enforcement of the drug laws of the Commonwealth, special agents 1 of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the 2 3 enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, or by the Delaware River Port Authority if a member of the Delaware River 4 5 Port Authority Police or by the county, township or municipality, by which he is employed, his full rate of salary, 6 as fixed by ordinance or resolution, until the disability 7 arising therefrom has ceased. All medical and hospital bills, 8 incurred in connection with any such injury, shall be paid by 9 10 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the Delaware River Port 11 Authority or by such county, township or municipality. During the time salary for temporary incapacity shall be paid by the 12 13 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the Delaware River Port 14 Authority or by the county, city, borough, town or township, any 15 workmen's compensation, received or collected by any such 16 employe for such period, shall be turned over to the 17 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or to the Delaware River Port 18 Authority or to such county, city, borough, town or township, and paid into the treasury thereof, and if such payment shall 19 20 not be so made by the employe the amount so due the Commonwealth 21 of Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port Authority or the 22 county, city, borough, town or township shall be deducted from any salary then or thereafter becoming due and owing. 23 24 In the case of the State Police Force, enforcement (b) 25 officers and investigators employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor 26 Control Board and the parole agents, enforcement officers and 27 investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, 28 Capitol Police officers, correction officers employed by the 29 Department of Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, 30 custody and control of inmates, psychiatric security aides

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employed by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department 1 of Corrections whose principal duty is the care, custody, and 2 3 control of the criminally insane, drug enforcement agents of the 4 Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws of the Commonwealth, special agents 5 of the Office of Attorney General whose principal duty is the 6 enforcement of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, members of 7 8 the Delaware River Port Authority Police [and], salaried 9 policemen and firemen, and sheriffs and deputy sheriffs who have 10 served for four consecutive years or longer, diseases of the 11 heart and tuberculosis of the respiratory system, contracted or incurred by any of them after four years of continuous service 12 13 as such, and caused by extreme overexertion in times of stress 14 or danger or by exposure to heat, smoke, fumes or gases, arising 15 directly out of the employment of any such member of the State 16 Police Force, enforcement officer, investigator employed by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, guard or enforcement officer 17 18 employed by the Department of Corrections or parole agent, 19 enforcement officer or investigator of the Pennsylvania Board of 20 Probation and Parole, Capitol Police officers, correction 21 officers employed by the Department of Corrections whose 22 principal duty is the care, custody and control of inmates, psychiatric security aides employed by the Department of Public 23 24 Welfare and the Department of Corrections whose principal duty 25 is the care, custody, and control of the criminally insane, drug 26 enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney General whose 27 principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws of the 28 Commonwealth, special agents of the Office of Attorney General 29 whose principal duty is the enforcement of the criminal laws of 30 the Commonwealth, member of the Delaware River Port Authority - 5 -20050S0243B0244

Police, [or] policeman or fireman, or sheriff or deputy sheriff 1 shall be compensable in accordance with the terms hereof; and 2 3 unless any such disability shall be compensable under the 4 compensation laws as having been caused by accidental injury, 5 such disability shall be compensable as occupational disease disabilities are presently compensable under the compensation 6 laws of this Commonwealth. It shall be presumed that 7 tuberculosis of the respiratory system contracted or incurred 8 9 after four consecutive years of service was contracted or 10 incurred as a direct result of employment.

(c) In the case of any person receiving benefits pursuant to this act, the statutes of limitations set forth in sections 306.1, 315, 413, and 434 of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as "The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act," shall not begin to run until the expiration of the receipt of benefits pursuant to this act.

17 (d) All payments herein required to be made by the 18 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania on account of any member of the 19 State Police Force shall be made from moneys appropriated to the 20 Pennsylvania State Police, and any payments required to be made 21 on account of any enforcement officer or investigator employed 22 by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board shall be from 23 appropriations out of the State Stores Fund, any payments 24 required to be made on account of any parole agent, enforcement 25 officer or investigator employed by the Pennsylvania Board of 26 Probation and Parole shall be from moneys appropriated to the 27 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, any payments 28 required to be made on account of Capitol Police officers shall 29 be made from moneys appropriated to the Department of General Services, any payments required to be made on account of any 30 – б – 20050S0243B0244

1 correction officer shall be made from moneys appropriated to the Department of Corrections, any payments required to be made on 2 3 account of any psychiatric security aides shall be made from 4 moneys appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare or the Department of Corrections where appropriate, and any payments 5 required to be made on account of any drug enforcement agent or 6 special agents shall be made from moneys appropriated to the 7 8 Office of Attorney General.

9 Section 2. Section 2 of the act is amended to read:
10 Section 2. No absence from duty of any such policeman,
11 <u>sheriff, deputy sheriff</u> or fireman by reason of any such injury
12 shall in any manner be included in any period of sick leave,
13 allowed such policeman, <u>sheriff, deputy sheriff</u> or fireman by
14 law or by regulation of the police, <u>sheriff's</u> or fire department
15 by which he is employed.

16 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
