AN ACT

Amending the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), entitled "An act establishing a special fund and account for money received by the Commonwealth from the Master Settlement Agreement with tobacco manufacturers; providing for home and community-based care, for tobacco use prevention and cessation efforts, for Commonwealth universal research enhancement, for hospital uncompensated care, for health investment insurance, for medical assistance for workers with disabilities, for regional biotechnology research centers, for the HealthLink Program, for community-based health care assistance programs, for PACE reinstatement and PACENET expansion, for medical education loan assistance and for percentage allocation and appropriation of moneys," further providing for use of Tobacco Settlement Fund.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Section $306(c)$ of the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), known as the Tobacco Settlement Act, is amended to read:

Section 306. Use of Tobacco Settlement Fund.

(c) Lapses.--Lapses shall be deposited in the Health Account
except for the following:
(1) Lapses from moneys provided for the home and community-based care services shall be reallocated to the home and community-based care program for use in succeeding years.
(2) Lapses from moneys provided for the health investment insurance program shall be reallocated to the health investment insurance program for use in succeeding years.
(3) Lapses from moneys provided for the hospital uncompensated care payment program shall be allocated to the health investment insurance program for use in succeeding years.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
