- 16 SECTION 3104. RESPONSIBILITY OF APPROVED EDUCATIONAL
- 17 INSTITUTION.
- 18 EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS PARTICIPATING IN THIS PROGRAM SHALL:
- 19 (1) SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE AGENCY FOR APPROVAL TO
- 20 PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM. THE APPLICATION SHALL IDENTIFY
- THE HIGH-TECH EMPLOYERS OR POTENTIAL EMPLOYERS WHO WILL
- 22 SPONSOR AN INTERNSHIP, THE WAGES THAT INTERNS SHALL BE PAID,
- 23 A DESCRIPTION OF THE GENERAL NATURE OF THE WORK TO BE

- 1 HIRED INTERN CAREER-RELATED WORK EXPERIENCE THAT BUILDS ON
- THAT STUDENT'S CLASSROOM KNOWLEDGE.
- 3 (4) EITHER THROUGH EMPLOYER FUNDS OR INSTITUTIONAL
- 4 FUNDS, PROVIDE THE FUNDS REQUIRED TO MATCH THE STATE
- 5 CONTRIBUTION.
- 6 (5) IMPLEMENT A PROCESS TO SCREEN AND APPROVE STUDENTS
- 7 FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM.
- 8 (6) OPEN RELEVANT RECORDS AND MATERIALS TO THE AGENCY
- 9 FOR REVIEW.
- 10 (7) HAVE A PROCESS TO MONITOR AND EVALUATE EACH
- 11 INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE.
- 12 (8) ADHERE TO ANY REQUIREMENTS OR CONDITIONS THAT THE
- 13 AGENCY [OR THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE
- 14 PENNSYLVANIA WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD AND THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 15 COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, MAY ADOPT.
- 16 Section 3106. Interns.
- 17 (a) Eligibility.--Undergraduate <u>and master's degree</u> students
- 18 enrolled in an approved course of instruction at an approved
- 19 educational institution shall be eligible to participate in the
- 20 program. Priority for participation shall be based on financial
- 21 need as determined by the educational institution and the
- 22 agency, but participation shall not be limited to those students
- 23 who qualify for financial aid.
- 24 (B) TERMS AND CONDITIONS. -- EACH INTERN SHALL COMPLY WITH ANY <---
- 25 CONDITIONS PLACED UPON THE INTERNSHIP BY THE AGENCY[,
- 26 DEPARTMENT] OR APPROVED EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION. EACH INTERN
- 27 SHALL COMPLY WITH ANY APPLICABLE REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY THE
- 28 EMPLOYER. INTERNS MAY WORK NO MORE THAN 20 HOURS A WEEK WHILE
- 29 THEY ARE ENROLLED ON A FULL-TIME BASIS AND MAY WORK NOT MORE
- 30 THAN 40 HOURS A WEEK DURING ANY BREAK.

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- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
