## AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, defining the offense of disarming a law enforcement officer; and providing a penalty. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 5104.1. Disarming law enforcement officer. 9 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the offense of disarming a law enforcement officer if he: 10 (1) removes or attempts to remove a firearm, rifle, 11 12 shotgun or weapon from the person of a law enforcement officer or corrections officer, or deprives a law enforcement 13 officer or corrections officer of the use of a firearm, 14 15 rifle, shotqun or weapon, when the officer is acting within 16 the scope of the officer's duties; and (2) has reasonable cause to know or knows that the 17

individual is a law enforcement officer or corrections
