AN ACT

- Amending the act of January 17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), entitled
 "An act establishing a fixed minimum wage and overtime rates
 for employes, with certain exceptions; providing for minimum
 rates for learners and apprentices; creating a Minimum Wage
 Advisory Board and defining its powers and duties; conferring
 powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Labor and
 Industry; imposing duties on employers; and providing
 penalties, "further providing for minimum wage.
- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. Section 4(a) and (a.1) of the act of January 17,
- 12 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968,
- 13 amended or added December 15, 1988 (P.L.1232, No.150), are
- 14 amended to read:
- 15 Section 4. Minimum Wages.--Except as may otherwise be
- 16 provided under this act:
- 17 (a) Every employer shall pay to each of his employes wages
- 18 for all hours worked at a rate of not less than:
- 19 (1) Two dollars sixty-five cents (\$2.65) an hour upon the
- 20 effective date of this amendment.

- 1 (2) Two dollars ninety cents (\$2.90) an hour during the year
- 2 beginning January 1, 1979.
- 3 (3) Three dollars ten cents (\$3.10) an hour during the year
- 4 beginning January 1, 1980.
- 5 (4) Three dollars thirty-five cents (\$3.35) an hour after
- 6 December 31, 1980.
- 7 (5) Three dollars seventy cents (\$3.70) an hour beginning
- 8 February 1, 1989[, and thereafter].
- 9 (6) Six dollars and twenty-five cents (\$6.25) an hour during
- 10 the year beginning January 1, 2006.
- 11 (7) Seven dollars and fifteen cents (\$7.15) an hour during
- 12 the year beginning January 1, 2007.
- 13 (8) Beginning January 1, 2008, and each succeeding January 1
- 14 thereafter, the minimum wage shall be increased by an annual
- 15 <u>cost-of-living adjustment calculated by applying the percentage</u>
- 16 change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-
- 17 <u>U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area,</u>
- 18 for the most recent twelve month-period for which figures have
- 19 been officially reported by the United States Department of
- 20 <u>Labor</u>, <u>Bureau of Labor Statistics sixty days prior to the date</u>
- 21 the adjustment is due to take effect, to the then current salary
- 22 amounts. The percentage increase and the minimum wage amounts
- 23 shall be determined by the secretary as herein prescribed and
- 24 public notice given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin within ten days
- 25 of the date such determination is made.
- 26 (a.1) If the minimum wage set forth in the Fair Labor
- 27 Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060, 29 U.S.C. § 201 et seq.)
- 28 is increased above [three dollars thirty-five cents (\$3.35) an
- 29 hour] the minimum wage required under this section, the minimum
- 30 wage required under this section shall be increased by the same

- 1 amounts and effective the same date as the increases under the
- 2 Fair Labor Standards Act, and the provisions of subsection (a)
- 3 are suspended to the extent they differ from those set forth
- 4 under the Fair Labor Standards Act.

- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
