AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 7, 2005 (P.L. , No.1A), entitled "An
2 act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the
3 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the
4 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for
5 the fiscal year July 1, 2005, to June 30, 2006, for certain
6 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills
7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year
8 ending June 30, 2005; to provide appropriations from the
9 State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance
10 Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores
11 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust
12 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the
13 Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the
14 Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology
15 Development Authority Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the
16 Health Care Provider Retention Account and the Community
17 Health Reinvestment Restricted Account to the Executive
18 Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial
19 Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial
20 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2005, to June 30,
21 2006; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund
22 for the fiscal year July 1, 2005, to June 30, 2006, for the
23 proper operation of the several departments of the
24 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to
25 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the
26 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of
27 the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted
28 receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 2005, to June
29 30, 2006, and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at
30 the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005; to provide
31 for the additional appropriation of Federal and State funds
32 from the General Fund and the Motor License Fund, for the
33 Executive and Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth for

1 the fiscal year July 1, 2004, to June 30, 2005, and for the
2 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close
3 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004." reducing the State
4 appropriation for education assistance and increasing the
5 Federal and State appropriations for medical assistance -
6 outpatient.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. As much of section 212 as relates to the State
10 appropriation for the Education Assistance Program and section
11 219 as relates to the Federal and State appropriations for
12 medical assistance - outpatient of the act of July 7, 2005 (P.L.
13 , No.1A), known as the General Appropriations Act of 2005, are
14 amended to read:

15 Section 212. Department of
16 Education.--The following amounts are
17 appropriated to the Department of
18 Education:

26 Section 219. Department of Public
27 Welfare.--The following sums are
28 appropriated to the Department of
29 Public Welfare:

31 For medical assistance payments -
32 outpatient services, exclusive of

1 outpatient services provided through
2 capitation plans. The Department of
3 Public Welfare shall not require a
4 recipient to obtain a physician
5 referral in order to receive
6 chiropractic services. The Department
7 of Public Welfare shall not expend or
8 authorize the expenditure of any funds
9 for family planning services in excess
10 of the amounts expended for such
11 services in the 2004-2005 fiscal year
12 and any such funds which are expended
13 shall be subject to the same
14 restrictions contained in the
15 appropriation for grants for women's
16 medical services. The Department of
17 Public Welfare shall not implement the
18 imposition of a monthly premium
19 requirement on the families of
20 category PH-95 disabled children.

23 The following Federal amounts are
24 appropriated to supplement the sum
25 appropriated for medical assistance -
26 outpatient:

27 (1) "Medical Assistance -
28 Outpatient." The Department of Public
29 Welfare shall not require a recipient
30 to obtain a physician referral in

1 order to receive chiropractic
2 services. The Department of Public
3 Welfare shall not expend or authorize
4 the expenditure of any funds for
5 family planning services in excess of
6 the amounts expended for such services
7 in the 2004-2005 fiscal year and any
8 such funds which are expended shall be
9 subject to the same restrictions
10 contained in the appropriation for
11 grants for women's medical services.

12 The Department of Public Welfare shall
13 not implement the imposition of a
14 monthly premium requirement on the
15 families of Category PH-95 disabled
16 children.
