AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, further providing for commercial driver's license
3 qualification standards.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 1607 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read:
8 § 1607. Commercial driver's license qualification standards.

10 (f) Waiver of driving skill test for veterans of the Armed
11 Forces of the United States.--Subject to the limitations and
12 requirements of 49 CFR 383.77 (relating to substitute for
13 driving skills tests), the department may waive the driving
14 skills test for an applicant who meets all certifications
15 required for waiver under 49 CFR 383.77 and who certifies that
16 he or she:

17 (1) is a member of the active or reserve components of

1 any branch or unit of the Armed Forces of the United States
2 or a veteran who received an honorable discharge from any
3 branch or unit of the active or reserve components of the
4 Armed Forces of the United States;

5 (2) is or was regularly employed in a position in the
6 Armed Forces of the United States requiring operation of a
7 commercial motor vehicle; and

8 (3) has legally operated, for at least two years
9 immediately preceding application for a commercial driver's
10 license, a vehicle representative of the commercial motor
11 vehicle the driver applicant operates or expects to operate,
12 either under the exemption from this Commonwealth's
13 commercial driver's license requirement provided by section
14 1606(b)(2) (relating to requirement for commercial driver's
15 license) or the equivalent exemption of another state or
16 while on active duty in a foreign jurisdiction.

17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
