A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing May 5, 2005, as the "National Day of Prayer" in
2 Pennsylvania.

1 women who sought wisdom through prayer; and

2 WHEREAS, Prayer has aided many people throughout the history
3 of our nation and this Commonwealth when support and guidance
4 were needed; therefore be it
