A RESOLUTION

1 Designating June 5, 2006, as "Ronald Reagan Day" in
2 Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, Ronald Wilson Reagan was born in Tampico, Illinois,
4 on February 6, 1911; and

5 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan died on June 5, 2004, in Bel-Air,
6 California, at 93 years of age; and

7 WHEREAS, From 1981 through 1989 Ronald Reagan served freedom
8 and the public good as the 40th President of the United States;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Throughout his presidency Ronald Reagan worked in a
11 bipartisan manner to advance a bold agenda to restore
12 accountability and common sense to government; and

13 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan led our nation to an economic
14 expansion, creating opportunities for millions of United States
15 citizens; and

16 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan's commitment to our armed forces and
17 his vision of "peace through strength" led to the end of the

1 Cold War, the demise of the former Soviet Union and
2 extraordinary new freedoms for millions of people; and

3 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan firmly emphasized a strong commitment
4 to criminal justice, victims' rights, deterrence of lawless
5 conduct and the collective moral voice of a free society; and

6 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan led our nation to a renewal of self-
7 confidence, initiated substantial tax reform and oversaw the
8 restoration of national prosperity; and

9 WHEREAS, June 5, 2006, marks the second anniversary of Ronald
10 Reagan's death; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate June 5, 2006, as "Ronald
12 Reagan Day" in Pennsylvania.
