## AN ACT

1 2	Amending Title 44 (Law and Justice) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for witness relocation.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 9 <u>"Program." The program established in section 3103 (relating</u>
- 10 to program).
- 11 <u>"Witness." An individual having knowledge of the existence</u>
- 12 or nonexistence of facts or information relating to a crime. The
- 13 term includes:
- 14 (1) An individual who has reported facts or information
- to a law enforcement officer or prosecuting official.
- 16 (2) An individual who has been served with a subpoena
- issued under the authority of the Commonwealth.
- 18 (3) An individual who has given written or oral
- 19 testimony or a statement in a criminal matter.
- 20 (4) An individual who is deemed by the Attorney General
- or the prosecuting official to be a witness.
- 22 § 3102. Administration.
- 23 The Attorney General has the following powers and duties:
- 24 (1) Administer the program.
- 25 (2) Promulgate procedures and guidelines to administer
- 26 <u>this chapter.</u>
- 27 § 3103. Program.
- 28 The Attorney General shall establish a Statewide witness
- 29 relocation program and may provide for the relocation of a
- 30 witness, a potential witness, a family member or other person

- 1 closely associated with the witness or potential witness in an
- 2 <u>official proceeding or investigation.</u>
- 3 § 3104. Admission.
- 4 (a) Eligibility. -- A prosecuting official that determines a
- 5 need for witness relocation may request funding from the
- 6 Attorney General. In an official proceeding or investigation
- 7 within this Commonwealth, if the prosecuting official requests
- 8 that a witness enter the program, the Attorney General may admit
- 9 the witness into the program.
- 10 (b) Agreement. -- If the Attorney General determines that a
- 11 witness is eligible under subsection (a), the following shall
- 12 apply:
- 13 (1) A witness voluntarily participating in the program
- must enter into a written agreement.
- 15 (2) In the written agreement under paragraph (1), the
- witness must agree to all of the following:
- 17 <u>(i) To testify in and provide truthful information</u>
- 18 to all appropriate law enforcement officials concerning
- 19 all appropriate proceedings.
- 20 <u>(ii) To refrain from committing a crime.</u>
- 21 (iii) To take necessary steps to avoid detection by
- 22 others of the facts concerning the relocation provided to
- the witness under this chapter.
- 24 (iv) To comply with legal obligations and civil
- judgments against the witness.
- 26 (v) To cooperate with reasonable requests of
- 27 officers and employees of the Commonwealth or a political
- 28 <u>subdivision who are providing relocation under this</u>
- chapter.
- 30 (vi) To designate another person to act as agent for

- 1 <u>the services of process.</u>
- 2 (vii) To make a sworn statement of all outstanding
- 3 legal obligations, including obligations concerning child
- 4 <u>custody and visitation.</u>
- 5 <u>(viii) To disclose any probation or parole</u>
- 6 responsibilities if the witness is currently under parole
- or probation supervision under the laws of another state.
- 8 (ix) To regularly inform the office of the witness's
- 9 <u>activities and current address.</u>
- 10 (x) To comply with other conditions requested by the
- 11 <u>prosecuting official.</u>
- 12 § 3105. Witness services.
- 13 (a) Coordination. -- The Attorney General in cooperation with
- 14 the prosecuting official shall coordinate the efforts to secure
- 15 relocation services for witnesses in the program.
- 16 (b) Funding. -- An appropriation shall be made to the Attorney
- 17 General to fund the program.
- 18 § 3106. Termination.
- 19 (a) Authority. -- A witness may be terminated from
- 20 participation in the program.
- 21 (b) Procedure.--Termination under this section is not
- 22 subject to 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 5 Subch. A (relating to practice and
- 23 procedure of Commonwealth agencies) and Ch. 7 Subch. A (relating
- 24 to judicial review of Commonwealth agency action).
- 25 § 3107. Confidentiality.
- 26 Except as otherwise required by law or required for the
- 27 implementation of the program, information relating to any
- 28 <u>witness participating in the program shall remain confidential</u>
- 29 and is not subject to disclosure.
- 30 <u>§ 3108. Immunity.</u>

- 1 The Commonwealth, its officers and employees, and State or
- 2 <u>county prosecuting attorneys or law enforcement agencies shall</u>
- 3 not be subject to any liability for any decision to provide or
- 4 not to provide protection under this chapter.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
