9	(a) General ruleOfficial action and deliberations by a

11	open to the public unless closed under section 707 (relating to

13	sessions) or 712 (relating to General Assembly meetings
14	covered).
15	(b) Election daysNo agency may conduct an open meeting

4 § 712. General Assembly meetings covered.

5 (a) General rule.--Notwithstanding any other provision, for the purpose of this chapter, meetings of the General Assembly 6 which are covered are as follows: all meetings of committees 7 8 where bills are considered, all hearings where testimony is 9 taken and all sessions of the Senate and the House of Representatives. Not included in the intent of this chapter are 10 caucuses or meetings of any ethics committee created pursuant to 11 12 the Rules of the Senate or the House of Representatives. 13 (b) Election days. -- The General Assembly may not conduct any meetings under this section on the day of any general election, 14 municipal election or primary election, as these terms are 15
