## AN ACT

Amending the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), entitled "An act relating to the regulation of the practice of pharmacy, including the sales, use and distribution of drugs and devices at retail; and amending, revising, consolidating and repealing certain laws relating thereto," further providing for drug therapy protocols.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 9.1(a) of the act of September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy Act, added June 29, 2002 (P.L.673, No.102), is amended to read:

Section 9.1. Drug Therapy Protocols.--(a) A pharmacist shall be permitted to enter into a written agreement or protocol with a licensed physician authorizing the management of drug therapy in an institutional setting. For purposes of this section, an institutional setting shall include an integrated health setting such as academic health centers and group practice settings where the pharmacist is an integral member of the interdisciplinary clinical team and has access to the patient's medical record.

Section 2. The State Board of Pharmacy shall promulgate regulations to implement the amendment of section 9.1(a) of the act within 18 months of the effective date of this section.

Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
