A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, providing for a limitation on the length of session.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of
8	Article XI:
9	That section 4 of Article II be amended to read:
10	§ 4. Sessions.
11	(a) The General Assembly shall be a continuing body during
12	the term for which its Representatives are elected. It shall
13	meet at 12 o'clock noon on the first Tuesday of January each
14	year. Special sessions shall be called by the Governor on
15	petition of a majority of the members elected to each House or
16	may be called by the Governor whenever in his opinion the public
17	interest requires.

1 (b) The General Assembly may not convene a voting session 2 from a time period beginning on the first Tuesday after the 3 first Monday in November through November 30 in any even-4 numbered year, unless the General Assembly is meeting in special 5 session as provided in section 4(a), or upon a two-thirds vote 6 of each House.

7 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General 8 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 9 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to 10 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 11 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 12 13 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 14 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

15 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this 16 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 17 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 18 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 19 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 20 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 21 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 22 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 23 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 24 25 primary, general or municipal election which meets the 26 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article 27 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least 28 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is 29 passed by the General Assembly.
