## AN ACT

1 2	Providing for the termination of law enforcement officers upon testing positive for a controlled substance.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. Short title.
6	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Law
7	Enforcement Officer Drug Screening Act.
8	Section 2. Definitions.
9	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
10	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
11	context clearly indicates otherwise:
12	"Controlled substance." A drug, substance or immediate
13	precursor specified in schedules I through V of section 4 of the
14	act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled
15	Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
16	"Drug."
17	(1) A substance recognized in the official United States

Pharmacopeia, or official National Formulary, or any
 supplement to either of them.

3 (2) A substance intended for use in the diagnosis, cure,
4 mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in man or
5 other animals.

6 (3) A substance, other than food, intended to affect the 7 structure or any function of the human body or other animal 8 body.

A substance intended for use as a component of any 9 (4)10 article specified in paragraph (1), (2) or (3), but not 11 including devices or their components, parts or accessories. "Immediate precursor." A substance which the Secretary of 12 13 Health has found to be, and by regulation designates as being, a principal compound commonly used or produced primarily for use, 14 15 and which is an immediate chemical intermediary used or likely to be used, in the manufacture of a controlled substance. 16

17 "Law enforcement officer." A person required to be trained 18 under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police 19 education and training) as well as a Pennsylvania State Police 20 officer, probation officer, prison guard, parole officer and any 21 person who has arrest powers in this Commonwealth.

22 Section 3. Effect of positive test.

A law enforcement officer who tests positive for a controlled substance shall be terminated from his employment as a law enforcement officer in this Commonwealth.

26 Section 4. Effective date.

27 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
