State Gaming Fund. -- The following amounts set 4 forth in this part, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 5 hereby appropriated from the State Gaming Fund to the agencies of the Executive Department named in this part for the purposes 6 set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and for 7 8 the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008. 9 10 Section 502. - 5 for the State Treasurer, the Secretary of the Budget, the
- 6 Secretary of Revenue or the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board to
- 7 transfer any money within or between the appropriations in Part
- 8 III or Part V.
- 9 Section 702. Effective date.--This act shall take effect
- 10 July 1, 2008, or immediately, whichever is later.
