б	Section 1. Section 4563(a) and (b) of Title 42 of the
7	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section
8	is amended by adding a subsection to read:
9	§ 4563. Protection of employment of petit and grand jurors.
10	(a) General ruleAn employer shall not deprive an employee
11	of his employment, seniority position or benefits, or threaten
12	or otherwise coerce him with respect thereto, because the
13	employee receives a summons, responds thereto, serves as a juror
14	or attends court for prospective jury service. [Nothing in this
15	section shall be construed to require the employer to compensate
16	the employee for employment time lost because of such jury
17	service.]

18 (b) Penalty.--Any employer who violates subsection (a) <u>or</u>

1 (f) commits a summary offense.

3	(f) Compensation to be paid by employer
4	(1) Except as otherwise provided under paragraph (2), an
5	employer of an employee who is a juror:
6	(i) shall continue to pay the employee who serves on
7	any jury the employee's regular compensation as if the
8	employee were on annual or sick leave; and
9	(ii) may not deduct days the employee spends on jury
10	duty from the annual or sick time accrued by the
11	employee,
12	provided that the employee authorizes the employer to offset
13	the jury duty allowance.
14	(2) The employer may deduct compensation to an employee
15	paid while the employee is a juror, minus the jury duty
16	allowance setoff, from the employer's income tax, in addition
17	to other adjustments to gross income which the employer may
18	take for the employee's compensation.
19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
