1 2	Recognizing the week of March 11 through 17, 2007, as "Girl Scout Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, March 12, 2007, marks the 95th anniversary of Girl
4	Scouts of the United States of America, the organization which
5	was founded by Juliette Gordon Low in 1912 in Savannah, Georgia;

7	WHEREAS, Throughout its long and distinguished history, Girl
8	Scouting has inspired millions of girls and women to achieve the
9	highest ideals of character, conduct and patriotism; and
10	WHEREAS, Through Girl Scouting, girls grow strong, gain self-

confidence and leadership skills and learn the lifelong lesson
of contributing to their communities; and

3 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting takes an active role in increasing 4 girls' awareness of the opportunities available to them today in 5 math, science, sports, technology and other fields that can 6 expand their horizons; and

7 WHEREAS, More than 3.8 million current Girl Scout members 8 Nationwide will be celebrating 95 years of this American 9 tradition with nearly 50 million women who are former Girl 10 Scouts and living proof of the impact of this amazing movement; 11 therefore be it
