A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- l Directing the appointment of a task force to study affordable
- health care insurance, health care access and quality health
- 3 care services for the citizens of this Commonwealth.
- 4 WHEREAS, Health care costs have been increasing twice as fast
- 5 as average wages in this Commonwealth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Approximately 767,000 Pennsylvanians remain
- 7 uninsured; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The large number of uninsured workers has a negative
- 9 impact on the economy and productivity in this Commonwealth
- 10 because insured workers are healthier and use fewer sick days;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, Governor Edward G. Rendell has proposed an ambitious
- 13 and laudable plan to provide health insurance for every
- 14 Pennsylvanian; and

- 1 WHEREAS, While the health care crisis is a national concern,
- 2 solutions addressing three fundamental issues--affordability,
- 3 accessibility and quality--can drive down health care costs and
- 4 improve the well-being of citizens in this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth has a clear interest in ensuring
- 6 that families and small employers in this Commonwealth can
- 7 afford health insurance because the cost of uninsured
- 8 Pennsylvanians drives up the cost of health care for all insured
- 9 citizens; and
- 10 WHEREAS, An estimated 6.5% of insurance premiums reflect the
- 11 more than \$1 billion required each year to offset the health
- 12 care charges for the uninsured; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth must contain health care coverage
- 14 premium increases for small employers, ensure the availability
- 15 of affordable health care coverage for workers who lose health
- 16 care benefits and the use of a substantial portion of premiums
- 17 for small employers to pay medical claims and require
- 18 justification for premium increases; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's health care market should be as
- 20 transparent as possible so all consumers can make well-informed
- 21 decisions in determining their health care choices and needs;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS, In order for the Commonwealth to expand access to
- 24 quality health care, all health care professionals need to be
- 25 able to practice to the fullest extent of their education,
- 26 training and skills while maintaining the highest level of
- 27 patient safety in the delivery of health care services; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth is paying billions of dollars each
- 29 year in avoidable health care costs; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Hospitals and health care providers need to focus on

- 1 medical errors that drive up health care costs and increase the
- 2 risk of negative outcomes or extended stays in hospitals; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The charges for uncompensated care for uninsured
- 4 persons, additional days of hospital care due to potentially
- 5 avoidable hospital-acquired infections, medical errors,
- 6 readmissions for complications or infections and avoidable
- 7 hospitalizations due to inadequate care of patients with chronic
- 8 diseases total \$7.6 billion per year; therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 10 establish a task force to study affordable health care
- 11 insurance, health care access and quality health care services
- 12 for the AS THEY RELATE TO PROVIDING HEALTH CARE TO UNINSURED
- 13 citizens of this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the task force shall explore all potential
- 15 funding sources so that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania can
- 16 quarantee health insurance coverage for all of its residents;
- 17 and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the task force be comprised of the following
- 19 members:
- 20 (1) The chairman and minority chairman of the Public
- 21 Health and Welfare Committee of the Senate.
- 22 (2) The chairman and minority chairman of the Health and
- 23 Human Services Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 24 (3) The chairman and minority chairman of the Banking
- and Insurance Committee of the Senate.
- 26 (4) The chairman and minority chairman of the Insurance
- 27 Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 28 (5) The chairman and minority chairman of the Consumer
- 29 Protection and Professional Licensure Committee of the
- 30 Senate.

1 (6) The chairman and minority chairman of the 2 Professional Licensure Committee of the House of 3 Representatives. 4 (7) The director of the Governor's Office of Health Care 5 Reform or a designee. 6 (8) The Insurance Commissioner or a designee. 7 (9) The Secretary of Health or a designee. 8 (10) One member appointed by the President pro tempore 9 of the Senate. (14) Five members appointed by the Governor to 16 THE SECRETARY OF PUBLIC WELFARE OR A DESIGNEE. 17 <----18 (11) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE. 19 20 (12) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE 21 SENATE. 22 ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MAJORITY LEADER OF THE 23 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. 2.4 (14) ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. 25 26 (15) SIX MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR TO include: 27 (i) A representative of hospitals or health systems. 28 (ii) A physician. (iii) A representative of the health insurance 29

industry.

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- 1 (iv) A representative of organized labor
- 2 representing licensed health care professionals.
- 3 (v) A representative of small business.
- 4 (VI) A PATIENT ADVOCATE;
- 5 and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That task force members be appointed within 30 days

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- 7 of the adoption of this resolution; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That within 15 days of the respective task force
- 9 appointments, the director of the Governor's Office of Health
- 10 Care Reform call the initial meeting of the task force, and at
- 11 such meeting the members elect a chairperson; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the task force be authorized to hold hearings,
- 13 take testimony and make investigations at such places as it
- 14 deems necessary in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That each member of the task force have power to
- 16 administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses appearing before
- 17 the task force; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That within 120 days of adoption of this
- 19 resolution, the task force report to the General Assembly on its
- 20 activities and findings and make recommendations; and be it
- 21 further
- 22 RESOLVED, That expenses incurred by the task force in
- 23 carrying out its responsibilities, including per diem and travel
- 24 expenses incurred by members and regular staff, stenographic
- 25 charges and other incidental expenses, be paid from appropriate
- 26 accounts under the control of the Chief Clerk of the Senate and
- 27 the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, one-half of the
- 28 expenses of the members to be paid by the Senate and one-half of
- 29 the expenses to be paid by the House of Representatives; and be
- 30 it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That within 30 days after the task force has made
- 2 its report, the chairperson cause a record of all expenses
- 3 incurred by the members of the task force, which are payable at
- 4 Commonwealth expense, to be filed with the Chief Clerk of the
- 5 Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives.
