## A RESOLUTION

Designating April 2, 2008, as "Kick Butts Day" in Pennsylvania.
WHEREAS, Youth empowerment is an essential element of
comprehensive tobacco control; and
WHEREAS, The Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids has reported that 419,810 children became regular smokers in 2007; and

WHEREAS, A 2007 study published in the Archives of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine indicates that nicotine addiction can develop quickly, within days, among the most susceptible children; and

WHEREAS, Tobacco addiction leads to premature death; and WHEREAS, With the global expansion of the tobacco industry, smoking-related deaths are expected to rise to 1 billion by the end of the 21st Century; and

WHEREAS, The hazards of secondhand smoke further plague an estimated 700 million children worldwide; and

WHEREAS, "Kick Butts Day" is an annual youth-led anti-tobacco initiative of the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids; and WHEREAS, On "Kick Butts Day," youths become leaders in the fight against tobacco by standing out, speaking up and seizing control in their homes, schools and communities; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April 2, 2008, as "Kick Butts Day" in Pennsylvania.
