A RESOLUTION

- 1 Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study
- 2 the operational costs and effectiveness of the Scotland
- 3 School for Veterans' Children.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Scotland School for Veterans' Children serves
- 5 this Commonwealth as an excellent educational institution, a
- 6 status it has maintained since 1895 when it originally opened as
- 7 the Pennsylvania Orphans' Industrial School; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Since the aftermath of the American Civil War this
- 9 school has provided a home and an education to Pennsylvania
- 10 children whose parents have died in conflict and in the course
- 11 of military service to this Commonwealth and the United States;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, The General Assembly recognizes the high level of
- 14 education and training received by those students enrolled in
- 15 the Scotland School for Veterans' Children; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The current economic climate has forced the
- 17 Commonwealth to reexamine the educational effectiveness of

- 1 State-funded programs; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 3 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to determine an
- 4 effective and appropriate level of funding per student, the
- 5 associated relative annual operational costs of the Scotland
- 6 School for Veterans' Children and the rate of matriculation and
- 7 the post-collegiate accomplishments of its alumni; and be it
- 8 further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 10 report all findings, conclusions and recommendations to the
- 11 House of Representatives within six months of passage of this
- 12 resolution.
