A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of October 20 through 24, 2008, as "National Business Women's Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Working women constitute 66 million of this nation's
4	work force and they strive to serve their communities, their
5	states and their nation in professional, civic and cultural

7	WHEREAS, Women-owned businesses account for 28% of all United
8	States businesses, generating \$1.15 trillion in sales; and
9	WHEREAS, In 1928, President Herbert Hoover designated the
LO	third week of October as "National Business Women's Week"; and
L1	WHEREAS, The major goals of Business and Professional
L2	Women/USA are to promote equality for all women and to help

create better conditions for working women through the study of
social, educational, economic and political issues; and
WHEREAS, For 75 years, various women's business groups have
been spotlighting the achievements and contributions of working
women during "National Business Women's Week"; therefore be it
