AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Protecting the right of a mother to nurse her child in public; prohibiting a unit of local government from adopting an ordinance prohibiting breastfeeding in public; and providing that breastfeeding may not be considered a nuisance, indecent exposure, sexual conduct or obscenity.
б	WHEREAS, There are benefits to the child, the mother and
7	society by encouraging and enabling mothers to breastfeed their
8	children; and
9	WHEREAS, An infant who is breastfed receives protection
10	against infection, illness and allergies, and long-term positive
11	effects on the development, intelligence and health of breastfed
12	children have been found; and
13	WHEREAS, A protective effect against various types of cancer
14	and greater emotional and physical health are found for mothers
15	who breastfeed; and
16	WHEREAS, Breastfeeding promotes sufficient birth spacing,
17	improved vaccine effectiveness and decreased food and medical
18	expenses, which all have positive societal effects; and
19	WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Supplemental Food Program for

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) promotes breastfeeding
 education and support; and

3 WHEREAS, Legislation to clarify the right to breastfeed is 4 necessary to promote breastfeeding and remove any stumbling 5 block from influencing a mother's decision to breastfeed or 6 continue breastfeeding.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the10 Right to Breastfeed Act.

11 Section 2. Declaration of policy.

12 The General Assembly finds that breastfeeding a baby is an 13 important and basic act of nurturing that must be protected in 14 the interests of maternal and child health and family values. 15 Section 3. General rule.

A mother has a right to breastfeed her child in any location, public or private, where the mother and child are otherwise authorized to be present, irrespective of whether or not the mother's breast is covered during or incidental to the breastfeeding.

21 Section 4. Local ordinance prohibition.

A unit of local government may not prohibit breastfeeding inpublic by local ordinance.

24 Section 5. Right to breastfeed.

25 The act of breastfeeding may not be considered:

(1) Indecent exposure as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. § 3127
(relating to indecent exposure).
