L2	(a) EstablishmentThe court of common pleas of a judicial

L5	COURTS OF SPECIALIZED JURISDICTION AS SPECIAL DOCKETS,	<
L6	INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DRUG COURTS, MENTAL HEALTH COURTS	
L7	AND DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE COURTS, WHEREBY defendants are	
L8	admitted to a court-supervised individualized treatment program.	
L9	The court may adopt local rules for the administration of

18	(4) Develop model guidelines for the administration of	
19	problem solving courts COURTS OF SPECIALIZED JURISDICTION and	<

21	(5) Establish procedures for monitoring problem-solving	
22	courts and their related treatment services and for	
23	evaluating the effectiveness of problem solving courts COURTS	<

26	(c) Advisory committeeThe Supreme Court may establish an	
27	interdisciplinary and interbranch advisory committee to advise
