AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled,
2 as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State
3 government; providing for the settlement, assessment,
4 collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts
5 due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and
6 other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth,
7 or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the
8 proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other
9 disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the
10 possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims
11 against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and
12 appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to
13 the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth
14 and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
15 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
16 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
17 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
18 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
19 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
20 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
21 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
22 department, board, commission, and officer of the State
23 government, every political subdivision of the State, and
24 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
25 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
26 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
27 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
28 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
29 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the
30 Commonwealth," PROVIDING FOR COMMONWEALTH EMPLOYEES GROUP
31 LIFE INSURANCE; further providing, in budget implementation,

1 for the State System of Higher Education; PROVIDING FOR <—
2 GENERAL BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION AND FOR 2007-2008 BUDGET
3 IMPLEMENTATION AND RESTRICTIONS ON APPROPRIATIONS FOR FUNDS
4 AND ACCOUNTS; AND MAKING A RELATED REPEAL.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

10 SECTION 1. THE ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.343, NO.176), KNOWN <—
11 AS THE FISCAL CODE, IS AMENDED BY ADDING AN ARTICLE TO READ:

12 ARTICLE XV-A

13 COMMONWEALTH EMPLOYEES GROUP LIFE INSURANCE

14 SECTION 1501-A. DEFINITIONS.

15 THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS ARTICLE
16 SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE
17 CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:

18 "ANNUAL PAY RATE." THE BASE PAY RATE ANNUALIZED AND, IN THE
19 CASE OF HOURLY ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES, SHALL BE COMPUTED ON THE
20 BASIS OF EXPECTED WORK HOURS.

21 "DEPARTMENT." THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES OF THE
22 COMMONWEALTH.

23 "EMPLOYEES." A PERMANENT, CONTINUOUSLY SCHEDULED EMPLOYEE OF
24 THE EXECUTIVE, JUDICIAL OR LEGISLATIVE BRANCH OF THE
25 COMMONWEALTH, ITS COMMISSIONS, BOARDS, DEPARTMENTS AND
26 AUTHORITIES. THE TERM SHALL INCLUDE MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL
27 ASSEMBLY.

28 "LIFE INSURANCE." LIFE INSURANCE PROCURED UNDER THIS
29 ARTICLE.

30 "SECRETARY." THE SECRETARY OF GENERAL SERVICES OF THE
31 COMMONWEALTH.

1 SECTION 1502-A. GROUP LIFE INSURANCE.

2 (A) PROCUREMENT BY DEPARTMENT.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER
3 SUBSECTION (B), THE DEPARTMENT, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
4 GOVERNOR AND WITH THE ADVICE OF THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER,
5 SHALL PROCURE FROM ONE OR MORE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANIES
6 AUTHORIZED TO DO BUSINESS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH A POLICY OR
7 POLICIES OF GROUP LIFE INSURANCE COVERING ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES.

8 (B) LEGISLATIVE BRANCH.--UPON WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE
9 SECRETARY, AN INDIVIDUAL AGENCY OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY
10 PROCURE LIFE INSURANCE FOR ITS ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING
11 MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN PLACE OF LIFE INSURANCE
12 AVAILABLE UNDER SUBSECTION (A). ANY LIFE INSURANCE PROCURED
13 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, MEET THE REQUIREMENTS
14 OF SECTIONS 1503-A, 1504-A, 1505-A, 1506-A AND 1508-A.

15 (C) ELIGIBILITY.--AN EMPLOYEE UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OR (B) IN
16 ACTIVE SERVICE SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR LIFE INSURANCE UNDER THIS
17 ARTICLE IF THE EMPLOYEE HAS COMPLETED THREE MONTHS' CONTINUOUS
18 SERVICE AS AN EMPLOYEE UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OR (B). TEMPORARY
19 EMPLOYEES SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE.

20 SECTION 1503-A. AMOUNT.

21 (A) SCHEDULE.--THE AMOUNT OF LIFE INSURANCE FOR ANY ELIGIBLE
22 EMPLOYEE SHALL BE BASED ON THE ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEE'S ANNUAL PAY
23 RATE FROM THE COMMONWEALTH IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SCHEDULE TO BE
24 SUBMITTED ANNUALLY BY THE SECRETARY FOR PUBLICATION IN THE
25 PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN.

26 (B) REDUCTION.--THE AMOUNT OF LIFE INSURANCE FOR ANY
27 ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES 70 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER SHALL BE ONE-HALF
28 THE AMOUNT OF LIFE INSURANCE PROVIDED UNDER THE SCHEDULE
29 PUBLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (A).

30 (C) CHANGE IN AMOUNT.--ANY CHANGE IN THE AMOUNT OF LIFE

1 INSURANCE MADE NECESSARY BY A CHANGE IN PAY SHALL TAKE EFFECT ON
2 THE NEXT SUCCEEDING PROGRAM ANNIVERSARY.

3 SECTION 1504-A. CONTRIBUTIONS.

4 (A) ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEE PAYMENT.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER
5 SUBSECTION (B), EACH ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEE COVERED BY LIFE INSURANCE
6 SHALL PAY, EITHER DIRECTLY OR BY MEANS OF A PAYROLL DEDUCTION
7 AUTHORIZED BY THE EMPLOYEE, THE COST OF THE INSURANCE IN AN
8 AMOUNT AS MAY BE DETERMINED FROM TIME TO TIME ON THE BASIS OF
9 THE ACTUAL TOTAL COSTS OF THE LIFE INSURANCE POLICY OR POLICIES
10 CONTRACTED FOR BY THE COMMONWEALTH.

11 (B) COMMONWEALTH PAYMENT.--THE COMMONWEALTH MAY AGREE TO PAY
12 ALL OR ANY OF THE COSTS FOR LIFE INSURANCE.

13 SECTION 1505-A. TERMINATION.

14 (A) CESSATION.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (B),
15 LIFE INSURANCE SHALL, SUBJECT TO ANY CONVERSION PRIVILEGE, CEASE
16 UPON THE OCCURRENCE OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

17 (1) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

18 (2) NONPAYMENT OF ANY CONTRIBUTION DUE FROM AN ELIGIBLE
19 EMPLOYEE.

20 (3) AFTER 12 CONTINUOUS MONTHS OF UNPAID ABSENCE.

21 (B) DISABILITY.--LIFE INSURANCE SHALL BE CONTINUED FOR
22 EMPLOYEES WHO TERMINATE AFTER BECOMING PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY
23 DISABLED WHILE COVERED UNDER THIS PROGRAM.

24 SECTION 1506-A. AUTOMATIC COVERAGE.

25 (A) PROVISION FOR COVERAGE.--ANY POLICY OF LIFE INSURANCE
26 SHALL PROVIDE THAT ALL ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY
27 COVERED COMMENCING ON THE DATE THEY FIRST BECOME ELIGIBLE.

28 (B) NOTICE.--AN EMPLOYEE DESIRING NOT TO BE COVERED BY LIFE
29 INSURANCE SHALL GIVE WRITTEN NOTICE, ON A PRESCRIBED FORM, TO
30 THE EMPLOYEE'S EMPLOYING OFFICE THAT THE EMPLOYEE DESIRES NOT TO

1 BE INSURED. IF THE NOTICE IS RECEIVED BEFORE THE EMPLOYEE
2 BECOMES INSURED UNDER THE POLICY, THE EMPLOYEE SHALL NOT BE
3 INSURED. IF THE NOTICE IS RECEIVED AFTER THE EMPLOYEE BECOMES
4 INSURED, THE EMPLOYEE'S INSURANCE UNDER THE POLICY WILL CEASE
5 EFFECTIVE WITH THE END OF THE PAY PERIOD DURING WHICH THE NOTICE
6 IS RECEIVED BY THE EMPLOYING OFFICE.

7 SECTION 1507-A. SECRETARY TO BE AGENT.

8 (A) AGENT.--EXCEPT FOR LIFE INSURANCE PROCURED UNDER SECTION
9 1502-A(B), THE SECRETARY IS EXCLUSIVELY AUTHORIZED AND SHALL
10 HAVE THE DUTY TO TRANSACT ALL BUSINESS NECESSARY FOR THE PURPOSE
11 OF CONTRACTING FOR INSURANCE UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

12 (B) COMMISSION.--THE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY OR COMPANIES
13 FROM WHOM LIFE INSURANCE IS PROCURED BY THE SECRETARY SHALL
14 COMPUTE COMMISSIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THEIR STANDARD PRACTICE
15 FOLLOWED IN OTHER SIMILAR PLANS. THE COMMISSIONS SHALL BE PAID
16 TO THE SECRETARY TO OFFSET ADMINISTRATIVE AND OTHER EXPENSES
17 INCURRED IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE INSURANCE PLAN.

18 SECTION 1508-A. APPLICABILITY OF INSURANCE LAWS.

19 ALL LIFE INSURANCE SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE LAWS OF THIS
20 COMMONWEALTH RELATING TO INSURANCE.

21 SECTION 2. SECTION 1737-B OF THE ACT, ADDED JULY 5, 2006
22 (P.L.296, NO.66), IS AMENDED TO READ:

23 Section 1737-B. State System of Higher Education.

25 The following shall apply to executive authorizations from
26 the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund for the
27 State System of Higher Education:

28 (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 12(b) of

1 fiscal year 2006-2007, the entire amount of the transfer
2 under section 1106-C(d) of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6,
3 No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, shall be paid to
4 the State System of Higher Education.
