AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Providing for grants to the performing arts; and conferring functions on the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Department of Revenue and the Office of the Budget.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Assistance
9	for the Performing Arts Act.
10	Section 2. Definitions.
11	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
12	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Department." The Department of Community and Economic
15	Development of the Commonwealth.
16	"Eligible cost." Any of the following expenses incurred by a
17	performing arts organization:
18	(1) Expenses for the acquisition, construction,

1 reconstruction, expansion, extension, demolition,

2 improvement, rehabilitation or remodeling of interests in
3 land, buildings, structures, improvements or infrastructure
4 of the performing arts facility.

5 (2) Administrative and operating costs and expenses
6 incurred by the performing arts organization.

7 "Office." The Office of the Budget of the Commonwealth.
8 "Performing arts organization." A nonprofit organization
9 that:

10 (1) has been in existence for at least five years; and
11 (2) regularly produces and performs live musical,
12 concert, dance, ballet and legitimate full-length play
13 productions in a hall or theater.

14 Section 3. Establishment.

15 There is established within the department a program to be 16 known as the Assistance Program for the Performing Arts. The 17 program shall provide grants to performing arts organizations in 18 this Commonwealth to assist with their administrative and 19 operating expenses.

20 Section 4. Application for program grant.

A performing arts organization located in and organized under the laws of this Commonwealth must submit a grant application to the department. The application must be on a department-approved form and must include:

(1) The name and address of the applicant.

26 (2) An accounting of all payroll taxes collected and
27 paid by the applicant under Article III of the act of March
28 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971,
29 during the prior calendar year.

30 (3) The number of full-time employees of the performing 20070S0769B0872 - 2 - 1 arts organization.

(4) Any other information required by the department.
 3 Section 5. Review.

4 (a) Department review.--Upon receipt of a completed
5 application, the department shall review the application and
6 ensure that the applicant is a bona fide performing arts
7 organization that has met all the requirements of the
8 department.

9 (b) Financial review.--

10 (1)The department shall forward the application to the 11 office and the Department of Revenue. The office and the Department of Revenue shall review the application. 12 13 Notwithstanding section 353(f) of the act of March 4, 1971 14 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, the 15 Department of Revenue may supply the department and the 16 office with information concerning the total taxes owed or 17 paid by an applicant or for which the applicant may otherwise 18 be liable.

19 (2) The office may accept, reject or adjust the estimate
20 of the amount of tax remitted or to be remitted to the
21 Commonwealth by the applicant.

22 Section 6. Approval.

(a) Time.--Within 60 days of receipt of the information from the Department of Revenue, the office shall determine if the amount of tax reported by the applicant is accurate and shall then notify the department.

(b) Grant approval.--Upon receipt of the notification under subsection (a), the department shall approve the application and award the applicant a grant in the amount of verified tax paid. (c) Accountability.--At the end of each year for which a 20070S0769B0872 - 3 - grant is awarded, the department shall ensure that the grant was
 used for the administrative and operating expenses of the
 performing arts organization.

4 (d) Limitations.--If sufficient funds are not appropriated
5 to cover the anticipated cost of the grants awarded in any given
6 fiscal year, the department shall prorate payments to performing
7 arts organizations.

8 Section 20. Effective date.

9 This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
