A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating April 15 through 21, 2007, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945 six million Jews were murdered in
- 4 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic pogrom of genocide,
- 5 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always
- 7 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such
- 8 horrors are never repeated and should continually rededicate
- 9 themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain
- 11 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and should recognize that
- 12 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and
- 13 WHEREAS, April 15, 2007, has been designated internationally
- 14 as a Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known
- 15 as Yom Hashoah; and
- 16 WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the people of this

- 1 Commonwealth to join in the international commemoration;
- 2 therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate April 15 through 21,
- 4 2007, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust"
- 5 in Pennsylvania, in memory of the victims of the Holocaust in
- 6 the hope that we may strive to overcome prejudice and inhumanity
- 7 through education, vigilance and resistance.
