- 1 Congratulating the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority on the
- organization's 100th anniversary.
- 3 WHEREAS, On January 15, 1908, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority
- 4 became America's first Greek-letter organization established by
- 5 black college women; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The sorority's roots date back to Howard University,
- 7 Washington, D.C., where the idea for formation was conceived by
- 8 Ethel Hedgeman Lyle of St. Louis, Missouri, who viewed the
- 9 sorority as an instrument for enriching the social and
- 10 intellectual aspects of college life by providing mental
- 11 stimulation through interaction with friends and associates; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Through the years, the sorority's function has
- 13 become more complex, branching out and becoming the channel
- 14 through which selected college-trained women improved the
- 15 socioeconomic conditions in their city, state, nation and the
- 16 world; and
- 17 WHEREAS, In a world in which materialism is pervasive and

- 1 technology and competition have decreased the need for
- 2 collaboration and cooperation, it is critical to have an
- 3 association that cuts across racial, international, physical and
- 4 social barriers to help individuals and communities develop and
- 5 maintain constructive relationships with others; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority is that vital
- 7 organization, a sisterhood composed of women who have
- 8 consciously chosen this affiliation as a means of self-
- 9 fulfillment through volunteer service, cultivating and
- 10 encouraging high scholastic and ethical standards, promoting
- 11 unity and friendship among college women, alleviating problems
- 12 concerning girls and women, maintaining a progressive interest
- 13 in college life and serving all mankind through a nucleus of
- 14 more than 200,000 women in the United States, the Caribbean,
- 15 Europe and Africa; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The members of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority are
- 17 educated women who are politically active, community-minded and
- 18 hold many levels of leadership in their churches, communities
- 19 and professions; therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Senate congratulate the Alpha Kappa Alpha
- 21 Sorority on the organization's 100th anniversary on January 15,
- 22 2008.
