## AN ACT

- 1 Providing for municipal volunteer fire service incentives.
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- 1 Section 502. Service record.
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- 5 Section 3002. Effective date.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 1
- 9 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS
- 10 Section 101. Short title.
- 11 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Municipal
- 12 Volunteer Firefighter Incentive Act.
- 13 Section 102. Purpose.
- 14 The purpose of this act is to authorize municipalities to
- 15 enact a tax credit against an active volunteer firefighter's
- 16 earned income tax liability as a financial incentive to:
- 17 (1) Indicate the municipality's acknowledgment of the
- value of and the absence of any public cost for volunteer
- 19 fire protection provided by active volunteer firefighters.
- 20 (2) To encourage other individuals to newly volunteer or
- 21 for former firefighters to consider rejoining as an active
- volunteer firefighter in a volunteer fire company.
- 23 Section 103. Definitions.
- 24 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 25 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 26 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 27 "Active volunteer firefighter." A volunteer firefighter who
- 28 has complied with the requirements of the volunteer fire service
- 29 credit program and who is certified under section 503.
- 30 "Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner of the

- 1 Commonwealth.
- 2 "Department." The Department of Revenue of the Commonwealth.
- 3 "Earned income tax." A tax on earned income and net profits
- 4 levied under chapter 3 of the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.
- 5 1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
- 6 "Governing body." A city council, borough council,
- 7 incorporated town council, board of township commissioners,
- 8 board of township supervisors, governing council of a home rule
- 9 municipality or optional plan municipality or a governing
- 10 council of any similar purpose government which may be created
- 11 by statute after the effective date of this section.
- "Local Tax Enabling Act." The act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.
- 13 1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
- 14 "Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town or
- 15 township located in this Commonwealth.
- "Tax credit." The tax credit granted under section 301.
- 17 "Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation,
- 18 association or organization located in this Commonwealth that
- 19 provides fire protection services and may offer other voluntary
- 20 emergency services within this Commonwealth.
- "Volunteer fire service credit program." The program
- 22 established under section 501 to determine the active status of
- 23 a volunteer firefighter.
- "Volunteer firefighter." A member of a volunteer fire
- 25 company.
- 26 CHAPTER 3
- 27 MUNICIPAL TAX CREDIT
- 28 Section 301. Program authorization.
- 29 (a) Establishment.--A municipality that levies an earned
- 30 income tax may establish by resolution or ordinance a tax credit

- 1 against an individual's liability imposed under chapter 3 of the
- 2 Local Tax Enabling Act for active service as a volunteer
- 3 firefighter.
- 4 (b) Amount.--A municipality must set forth in the resolution
- 5 or ordinance the amount of the tax credit. If the total earned
- 6 income tax liability is less than the amount established by the
- 7 municipality, the tax credit shall equal the remaining tax
- 8 liability.
- 9 (c) Public notice. -- At least 30 days prior to adoption of
- 10 the resolution or ordinance, the governing body of a
- 11 municipality shall give public notice of its intent to adopt a
- 12 resolution or ordinance to establish a tax credit and conduct at
- 13 least one public hearing on the issue.
- 14 (d) Specific notice. -- A municipality that establishes a tax
- 15 credit under subsection (a) shall notify the commissioner in the
- 16 manner and pursuant to any schedule prescribed by the
- 17 commissioner.
- 18 Section 302. Claim.
- 19 (a) Eligibility. -- An individual who satisfies all of the
- 20 following criteria may claim a tax credit established under this
- 21 act:
- 22 (1) The individual is subject to an earned income tax
- imposed by a municipality that has established a tax credit
- 24 under section 301.
- 25 (2) The individual is certified under section 503.
- 26 (b) Return.--A husband and wife may claim any tax credit for
- 27 which they are eligible on the same return.
- 28 Section 303. Limitations.
- 29 A tax credit established under this act may be used against
- 30 only the individual's earned income tax liability for the

- 1 current taxable year.
- 2 CHAPTER 5
- 3 VOLUNTEER FIRE SERVICE CREDIT
- 4 Section 501. Volunteer fire service credit program.
- 5 (a) Establishment.--Within 90 days of the effective date of
- 6 this section, the commissioner shall establish a volunteer fire
- 7 service credit program that establishes the annual requirements
- 8 for the designation of a volunteer firefighter as in active
- 9 service at a volunteer fire company.
- 10 (b) Activities. -- The volunteer fire service credit system
- 11 shall consider the following activities in determining credit
- 12 toward a designation of active service:
- 13 (1) The number of emergency calls to which a volunteer
- 14 firefighter responds.
- 15 (2) The level of training and participation in formal
- training and drills for a volunteer firefighter.
- 17 (3) The total amount of time expended by a volunteer
- 18 firefighter on administrative and other support services,
- including fundraising and facility or equipment maintenance.
- 20 (4) The involvement in other events or projects that aid
- 21 the financial viability, emergency response or operational
- readiness of a volunteer fire company.
- 23 (c) Guidelines. -- The commissioner shall adopt guidelines,
- 24 including forms, necessary to implement this section.
- 25 Section 502. Service record.
- 26 (a) Log.--The chief of a volunteer fire company or the
- 27 chief's designee shall establish and maintain a service log that
- 28 documents the activities of each volunteer firefighter that
- 29 qualify for credit toward active service under the volunteer
- 30 fire service credit system and the calculation of the total

- 1 credits earned for each volunteer firefighter in the volunteer
- 2 fire company.
- 3 (b) Review. -- Service logs established and maintained by
- 4 volunteer fire companies shall be subject to periodic review by
- 5 the Auditor General, the department, the governing body of the
- 6 municipality where the volunteer fire company is located and the
- 7 governing body of a municipality where the volunteer fire
- 8 company provides fire protection services or volunteer emergency
- 9 services.
- 10 Section 503. Certification.
- 11 (a) Self-certification. -- The active volunteer firefighter
- 12 shall sign and submit the application to the chief of the
- 13 volunteer fire company where the firefighter serves.
- 14 (b) Local sign-off.--The chief and another officer of the
- 15 volunteer fire company shall sign the application attesting to
- 16 the individual's status as an active volunteer firefighter. The
- 17 application shall then be forwarded to the municipality for
- 18 final review and processing.
- 19 CHAPTER 30
- 20 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
- 21 Section 3001. Penalties for false reporting.
- 22 The following shall apply:
- 23 (1) Any person who knowingly makes or conspires to make
- 24 a false service record report under this act to the
- commissioner commits a misdemeanor of the first degree
- 26 PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF \$2,500.
- 27 (2) Any person who knowingly provides or conspires to
- 28 provide false information that is used to compile a service
- 29 record report under this act commits a misdemeanor of the
- first degree PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF \$2,500.

- 1 Section 3002. Effective date.
- 2 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
