AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled 1 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 2 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; 5 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 6 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 7 9 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," further providing for special elections for 11 United States Senator and nominations. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 626 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, 16 No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, amended August 13, 1963 (P.L.707, No.379), is amended to read: 17 18 Section 626. Special Elections for United States Senator; 19 Nominations. -- Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the office of 20 United States Senator, said vacancy shall be filled for the 21 unexpired term by the vote of the electors of the State at a

special election to be held at the time of the next general or

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- 1 municipal election, occurring [at least] not more than one
- 2 <u>hundred twenty (120) nor less than</u> ninety (90) days after the
- 3 happening of such vacancy, and it shall be the duty of the
- 4 Governor to issue writs of election to the various county boards
- 5 of elections and to the Secretary of the Commonwealth within ten
- 6 (10) days after the happening of said vacancy. The Governor
- 7 <u>shall call for a special election on a date other than the next</u>
- 8 <u>general or municipal election if the general or municipal</u>
- 9 <u>election is scheduled more than one hundred twenty (120) days</u>
- 10 after the happening of such vacancy, which election shall occur
- 11 not more than one hundred twenty (120) nor less than ninety (90)
- 12 days after the happening of such vacancy. A special election may
- 13 not be held less than forty-five (45) days immediately preceding
- 14 or forty-five (45) days next succeeding a general or municipal
- 15 <u>election</u>. If, in order to meet the one hundred twenty (120) day_
- 16 requirement, the date of a special election would occur less
- 17 than forty-five (45) days immediately preceding or forty-five
- 18 (45) days next succeeding a general or municipal election, the
- 19 special election shall occur the first Tuesday after the forty-
- 20 fifth day following the general or municipal election.
- 21 Candidates to fill vacancies in the office of United States
- 22 Senator shall be nominated by political parties, in accordance
- 23 with the party rules relating to the filling of vacancies, by
- 24 means of nomination certificates, in the form prescribed in
- 25 section 630 of this act; and by political bodies, by means of
- 26 nomination papers, in accordance with the provisions of sections
- 27 951, 952 and 954 of this act. Said nomination certificates and
- 28 nomination papers shall be filed in the office of the Secretary
- 29 of the Commonwealth at least sixty (60) days prior to the date
- 30 of said special election. Until such time as said vacancy shall

- 1 be filled by an election as herein provided, the Governor of the
- 2 Commonwealth may make a temporary appointment to fill said
- 3 vacancy.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
