AN ACT

- Amending the act of October 30, 1996 (P.L.732, No.131), entitled "An act establishing grounds upon which innkeepers may deny accommodations, facilities or privileges of a lodging establishment to any person who is unable or unwilling to pay 4 for accommodations and services, to any person who is disorderly, to any person who an innkeeper reasonably 7 believes is seeking accommodations for any unlawful purpose and to any person who an innkeeper reasonably believes is 8 bringing upon the lodging establishment property which may be 9 dangerous to other persons; allowing an innkeeper to limit 10 the number of persons who shall occupy any particular quest 11 room of a lodging establishment; providing for the posting of notice relative to this statute; and providing for 12 13 penalties," providing for prospective employee background 14 checks; and requiring deadbolt locks in hotels. 15 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 17 hereby enacts as follows: 18 Section 1. The act of October 30, 1996 (P.L.732, No.131), known as the Pennsylvania Innkeepers' Rights Act, is amended by 20 adding sections to read: 21 Section 7.1. Background checks.
- 22 (a) General rule. -- An EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D),

- 1 AN innkeeper shall require an individual applying for employment
- 2 with a lodging establishment who would have access to guest room
- 3 keys if employed to undergo a check of criminal history record
- 4 information.
- 5 (b) Criminal history record information. -- Notwithstanding
- 6 the provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. § 9121(b)(2) (relating to general
- 7 <u>regulations</u>), an innkeeper who requests a check of criminal
- 8 <u>history record information shall be entitled to receive</u>
- 9 notations of arrests, indictments and other information relating
- 10 to the initiation of criminal proceedings occurring within seven
- 11 years from the date of the request.
- 12 (c) Use of information. -- Whenever an innkeeper is in receipt
- 13 of information which is part of an individual's criminal history
- 14 record information file, the innkeeper may use that information
- 15 for the purposes of deciding whether or not to hire the
- 16 applicant only in accordance with 18 Pa.C.S. § 9125 (relating to
- 17 use of records for employment) and shall provide the applicant
- 18 notice regarding a decision not to hire as provided in 18
- 19 Pa.C.S. § 9125(c).
- 20 (D) APPLICABILITY. -- THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTIONS (A), (B)
- 21 AND (C) SHALL NOT APPLY TO AN INNKEEPER WHO OWNS OR OPERATES A
- 22 LODGING ESTABLISHMENT WITH 20 OR FEWER GUEST ROOMS.
- 23 (d) (E) Definition.--As used in this section, the term
- 24 "check of criminal history record information" means a criminal
- 25 history record check under 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 91 (relating to
- 26 criminal history record information) or a substantially
- 27 <u>equivalent system of checking of criminal history record</u>
- 28 information as determined by the Pennsylvania State Police, a
- 29 <u>list of which the Pennsylvania State Police shall publish in the</u>
- 30 Pennsylvania Bulletin annually.

- 1 <u>Section 7.2. Deadbolt locks required in hotels.</u>
- 2 (a) General rule. -- An innkeeper of a hotel shall provide
- 3 each connecting guest room door of the hotel with a deadbolt
- 4 lock capable of being unlocked from inside the protected guest
- 5 room side only and shall maintain the deadbolt locks in good
- 6 working order at all times.
- 7 (b) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 8 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 9 <u>subsection:</u>
- 10 "Deadbolt lock." A locking bolt with a minimum projection of
- 11 one inch that is activated by knob, handle or other similar
- 12 device.
- 13 "Hotel." A hotel, motel, bed and breakfast, homestead, inn,
- 14 guest house or other structure which holds itself out by any
- 15 means, including advertising, license, registration with an
- 16 <u>innkeepers' group, convention listing association, travel</u>
- 17 publication or similar association or with a government agency,
- 18 as being available to provide overnight lodging or use of
- 19 <u>facility space for consideration to persons seeking temporary</u>
- 20 accommodation. The term includes a place which advertises to the
- 21 public at large or any segment thereof that it will provide
- 22 beds, sanitary facilities or other space for a temporary period
- 23 to members of the public at large. The term also includes a
- 24 place recognized as a hostelry.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
