AN ACT

Requiring the design, construction and renovation of STATE-OWNED OR STATE-LEASED buildings that receive a State appropriationto comply with specified energy and environmental building standards. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Short title. 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the High-Performance, State Funded STATE Buildings Standards Act. 10 Section 2. Purpose. 11 The General Assembly declares the purposes of this act as follows: 12 13 (1)To promote effective energy and environmental

standards for construction, rehabilitation and maintenance of

buildings in this Commonwealth.

- To optimize the energy performance of STATE
- 2 buildings throughout this Commonwealth.

- 3 To increase the demand for environmentally preferable building materials, finishes and furnishings. 4
- 5 To improve environmental quality in this (4)6 Commonwealth by decreasing the discharge of pollutants from 7 buildings and their manufacture.
 - To create public awareness of new technologies that can improve the health and productivity of building occupants by meeting advanced criteria for indoor air quality.
- 11 To improve working conditions and reduce building-12 related health problems.
 - To reduce this Commonwealth's dependence upon imported sources of energy through buildings that conserve energy and utilize local and renewable energy sources.
- 16 To protect and restore this Commonwealth's natural 17 resources by avoiding development of inappropriate building 18 sites.
- 19 To reduce the burden on municipal water supply and 20 treatment by reducing potable water consumption.
- 21 (10)To reduce waste generation and to manage waste 22 through recycling and diversion from landfill disposal.
- 23 (11)To improve the Commonwealth's capacity to design, 24 build and operate high-performance buildings and, in doing
- 25 so, to create new jobs and contribute to economic growth.
- 26 Section 3. Definitions.
- 27 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 28 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 29 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 30 "Building project." The design, construction or renovation

- 1 of any physical structure and its associated project building
- 2 site.
- 3 "Commonwealth agency." An executive agency, an independent
- 4 agency, a State-affiliated entity or State-related institution
- 5 as defined by 62 Pa.C.S. § 103 (relating to definitions). The
- 6 term also includes the General Assembly, its officers and
- 7 agencies and the unified judicial system and its officers and
- 8 agencies.
- 9 "Department." The Department of General Services of the
- 10 Commonwealth.
- 11 "High-performance building." A building designed to achieve
- 12 integrated systems design and construction so as to
- 13 significantly reduce or eliminate the negative impact of the
- 14 built environment.
- 15 "Major facility project." Any of the following:
- 16 (1) A State funded new STATE-OWNED construction project
- in which the building to be constructed is larger than 20,000
- 18 gross square feet.
- 19 (2) A State-funded building renovation project where the
- 20 State funding exceeds \$1,000,000 of the construction cost.
- 21 (3) A new construction project in which the building to
- be constructed is more than 10,000 gross square feet and in
- which building a Commonwealth agency has agreed to lease NO
- 24 FEWER THAN 90% of the gross square feet.
- 25 The term does not include a building, regardless of size, that
- 26 does not have conditioned space as defined by Standard 90.1 of
- 27 the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-
- 28 Conditioning Engineers, referred to as ASHRAE 90.1.
- 29 "Renovation project." A building project involving the
- 30 modification or adaptive reuse of an existing facility.

- 1 "State-funded." In reference to a building project, the term-
- 2 refers to a receipt of funds from a State appropriation, in-
- 3 whole or part, whether by means of direct payment,
- 4 reimbursement, grant or loan, other than an appropriation for
- 5 the renovation of leased facilities.
- 6 Section 4. Standards.
- 7 (a) Minimum criteria. -- The high-performance building
- 8 standards applicable to this act shall meet the following
- 9 minimum criteria:
- 10 (1) Be consensus-based, as defined by the Office of
- 11 Management and Budget, Circular No. A-119, dated February 10,
- 12 1998.
- 13 (2) At a minimum, include performance-based categories
- or credits that will foster achievement of the purposes set
- forth under section 2(2), (3), (4), (6), (7), (8), (9) and
- 16 (10).
- 17 (3) Require documentation, verifiable calculations or
- 18 the equivalent procedure to substantiate and support any
- 19 claim made relating to paragraph (2).
- 20 (4) Employ third-party, postconstruction review and
- 21 verification for achievement of certification.
- 22 (5) Have a track record of certified green buildings in
- 23 the United States.
- 24 (b) Level of performance. -- The performance required under
- 25 the adopted high-performance building standards shall be at or
- 26 above the level beyond the minimum level required by the
- 27 selected standards.
- 28 (c) Energy Star ratings.--
- 29 (1) In addition to meeting the performance requirements
- of the adopted high performance building standards, all

- 1 building projects involving buildings owned or leased by a
- 2 Commonwealth agency, including State funded major facility
- 3 projects, are required to achieve an Environmental Protection
- 4 Agency Energy Star rating of 85 or above.
- 5 (2) Paragraph (1) shall apply only to construction
- 6 projects which commence after the effective date of this act
- 7 and involve building types in which the Environmental
- 8 Protection Agency provides Energy Star ratings.
- 9 Section 5. Scope.
- 10 (a) Facilities owned by a Commonwealth agency. -- All building
- 11 projects shall meet or exceed the prescribed level of
- 12 achievement under the high-performance building standard adopted
- 13 under section 6.
- 14 (b) State funded major facility projects. When a
- 15 Commonwealth agency approves a project to be State-funded, it-
- 16 shall require the use of standards adopted under section 6-
- 17 during the design and construction phase of the project.
- 18 Section 6. Regulations.
- 19 (a) General rule. The department, in consultation with the
- 20 Department of Environmental Protection, shall develop and issue
- 21 regulations for complying with this act. The purposes of the
- 22 regulations shall be to:
- 23 (1) Adopt high-performance building standards selected
- by the department, in consultation with the Department of
- 25 Environmental Protection, from among accepted industry
- 26 standards meeting the criteria prescribed in section 4(a).
- 27 (2) Define reporting requirements for State-funded
- 28 building projects under this act.
- 29 (3) Define procedures and methods for verifying
- 30 compliance with the standards, as set forth under sections 4

- and 5, in the design and construction of State-funded STATE-
- OWNED OR STATE-LEASED building projects under SUBJECT TO this

- 4 $\frac{(4)}{(3)}$ (3) Specify the level of achievement to be met under
- 5 section 5.
- 6 (b) Amendment. The department, in consultation with the
- 7 Department of Environmental Protection, may amend the
- 8 regulations as necessitated by the emergence of new or modified
- 9 high-performance building standards as defined under section 4.
- 10 Section 7. Report.
- 11 The department shall prepare and submit annually a report to
- 12 the chairman and the minority chairman of the Environmental
- 13 Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate and the chairman
- 14 and the minority chairman of the Environmental Resources and
- 15 Energy Committee of the House of Representatives. The report
- 16 shall at a minimum include:
- 17 (1) The number and type of buildings designed and
- 18 constructed utilizing each of the rating systems recognized
- 19 under this act.
- 20 (2) The levels of certification of each building
- 21 designed, constructed or renovated.
- 22 (3) Actual or anticipated savings in energy consumption.
- 23 (4) A description of all potential environmental
- benefits, including, but not limited to, water resources
- savings and the reduction of waste generation.
- 26 (5) Any conflicts or barriers identified which hinder
- 27 the effective implementation of this act.
- 28 Section 8. Monitoring and evaluation.
- 29 The department, in consultation with the Department of
- 30 Environmental Protection, shall develop and implement a process

- 1 to monitor and evaluate the energy and environmental benefits
- 2 associated with each building project designed, constructed or
- 3 renovated under this act. The Commonwealth agency occupying the
- 4 building shall commence monitoring and evaluation in accordance
- 5 with the department-established process one year after the
- 6 completion and occupancy of the building project and continue
- 7 for five years thereafter.
- 8 Section 9. Applicability.
- 9 This act shall apply as follows:
- 10 (1) The provisions of this act shall apply to all
- 11 project design contracts initiated on or after the effective
- 12 date of this section.
- 13 (2) The provisions of this act shall apply to all
- 14 project construction contracts initiated after one year
- 15 following the effective date of this section.
- 16 Section 10. Enforcement.
- 17 The department shall not enforce the provisions of this act
- 18 as they apply to building projects owned or leased by a
- 19 Commonwealth agency until the Secretary of General Services and
- 20 the Secretary of the Budget determine there is adequate funding
- 21 available to cover additional costs resulting from compliance
- 22 with the requirements of this act.
- 23 Section 11. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days. AS FOLLOWS:
- 25 (1) SECTION 5 SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN ONE YEAR.
- 26 (2) THIS SECTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
- 27 (3) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60
- 28 DAYS.
