7	Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

9	§ 8332.9. Immunity of humane society police officers.
10	<u>(a) Status as public employees</u>
11	(1) Humane society police officers shall be treated as
12	if they were public employees as defined under section 8501
13	(relating to definitions) in performance of their duties of
14	<u>investigation and enforcement of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511(i)</u>
15	(relating to cruelty to animals) as delegated by the laws of
16	this Commonwealth.
17	(2) This action shall not be construed to reduce or
18	eliminate any other immunity provided to humane society

1 police officers by law.

2	(b) Immunity establishedA humane society police officer
3	performing an investigation or enforcement of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511_
4	as delegated by the laws of this Commonwealth shall be immune
5	from any civil action for damages brought by or on behalf of any
6	person involved in the investigation or enforcement of 18
7	<u>Pa.C.S. § 5511.</u>
8	(c) ConstructionNothing in this section shall be
9	construed to limit or otherwise affect or preclude liability
10	resulting from gross negligence or intentional misconduct or
11	reckless misconduct.
12	(d) DefinitionsThe words and phrases in this section
13	shall have the same meanings given to them in the act of
14	December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law.
15	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
