1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), entitled "An act relating to health care; prescribing the powers and duties of the Department of Health; establishing and providing the powers and duties of the State Health Coordinating Council, health systems agencies and Health Care Policy Board in the Department of Health, and State Health Facility Hearing Board in the Department of Justice; providing for certification of need of health care providers and prescribing penalties," in licensing of health care facilities, further providing for definitions and for

12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. Section 802.1 of act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130,
15	No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act, is amended by
16	adding a definition to read:
17	Section 802.1. Definitions.
18	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
19	shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
20	meanings given them in this section:

2	"Dementia." An irreversible global loss of cognitive
3	function causing evident intellectual impairment which always
4	includes memory loss, without alteration of state of
5	consciousness, as diagnosed by a physician and which is severe
6	enough to interfere with work or social activities, or both, and
7	to require continuous care or supervision.

9	Section 2. Section 806 of the act is amended by adding a
10	subsection to read:
11	Section 806. Licensure.

13	(h) Long-term care nursing facility consumer disclosuresA
14	long-term care nursing facility that provides care for consumers
15	diagnosed with dementia shall disclose to consumers and their
16	legal representatives and provide a written statement of:
17	(1) The facility's philosophy and mission which reflects
18	the needs of consumers with dementia.
19	(2) A description of the facility's physical environment
20	and design features to support the functioning of consumers
21	with dementia.
22	(3) A description of the frequency and types of
23	individual and group activities designed specifically to meet
24	the needs of consumers with dementia.
25	(4) A description of security measures provided by the
26	facility.
27	(5) A description of training provided to staff
28	regarding provision of care to consumers with dementia.
29	(6) A description of availability of family support
30	programs and family involvement.

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- 1 (7) The process used for assessment and establishment of a plan of services for the consumer, including methods by 2 which the plan of services will remain responsive to changes 3 in the consumer's condition. 4 (8) The process used to address emergency situations 5 that may occur as a result of an aggressive or_ 6 uncharacteristic manifestation of the dementia that would 7 8 pose a threat to the health and safety of the consumer, other 9 consumers or staff, thereby prompting a need for immediate discharge or transfer of the consumer. 10 Section 3. This act shall apply to consumers admitted on or 11 after the effective date of this section. 12
- 13 Section 4. This act shall take effect in six months.
