AN ACT

Amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), entitled "An act providing for victims' rights; imposing 2 penalties; establishing remedies; establishing the Office of 3 Victim Advocate, the Bureau of Victims' Services, the Victims' Services Advisory Committee, the State Offender Supervision Fund and other funds; and making repeals, "further 6 providing for powers and duties of victim advocate. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 302 of the act of November 24, 1998 11 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, amended 12 October 2, 2002 (P.L.839, No.121), is amended to read: 13 Section 302. Powers and duties of victim advocate. 14 The victim advocate has the following powers and duties: 15 To represent the interests of individual crime (1)16 victims before the board, department or hearing examiner. 17 To supervise the victim notification duties 18 presently conducted by the board. 19 To assist in and coordinate the preparation of (3) 20 testimony by the crime victims as set forth in sections

- 501(c) and 502 or the submission of oral, written or
- 2 videotaped comments by crime victims prior to a release
- 3 decision.
- 4 (4) To represent the interests of a crime victim under section 502.
- (5) To act as a liaison with the victim notification
 program director in the department to coordinate victim
 notification and services for the department and the board.

 The victim advocate is authorized to address the interests of all victims before the board, department or hearing examiner concerning any issues determined appropriate by the victim advocate.
- 13 (6) To act as an advocate for victims and survivors of
 14 traffic accidents and their families by offering services
 15 including, but not limited to, grief and crisis counseling,
 16 assistance with preparing victim compensation claims other
 17 than third-party legal action, connecting individuals with
 18 other service providers and supplying emergency financial
 19 assistance.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
