## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 27, 1996 (P.L.403, No.58), entitled "An
act to enhance community and economic development in this
Commonwealth by restructuring certain administrative
functions and entities; changing the name of the Department
of Commerce to the Department of Community and Economic
Development; transferring functions of the Department of
Community Affairs into the Department of Community and
Economic Development and other agencies; providing for a
Deputy Secretary for Community Affairs and Development in the
Department of Community and Economic Development;
establishing the Center for Local Government Services and the
Local Government Advisory Committee; establishing the Small
Business Advocacy Council; conferring powers and duties on
the Legislative Reference Bureau; and making repeals,"
further providing for the establishment of the Center for
Local Government Services, for the Local Government Advisory
Committee, for quorum and meetings and for compensation and
expenses.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Sections 301(c), 503, 505 and 506(a) of the act
of June 27, 1996 (P.L.403, No.58), known as the Community and
Economic Development Enhancement Act, are amended to read:
Section 301. To Department of Community and Economic
Development.

2 (c) Center for Local Government Services established.--A 3 Center for Local Government Services shall be established and maintained in the department to serve as the link between the 4 Commonwealth and local governments. The center shall be a 5 6 provider of services to local governments, shall serve as the 7 point of contact for local governments on issues and problems of local concern, shall be responsible for coordinating State 8 program resources in response to local issues and problems and 9 10 shall establish a systematic process for addressing local issues 11 and problems involving the resources of more than a single 12 agency. In carrying out its responsibilities, the center shall 13 use and have access to the information, services, functions and 14 other resources transferred under subsection (a). The center 15 shall, when authorized by the Governor, use and have access to 16 any other information, services, functions and other resources in the possession of executive agencies under the Governor's 17 18 jurisdiction deemed necessary to the fulfillment of its 19 responsibilities. The center shall provide to local governments, 20 at no cost, information on purchase contracts for materials, 21 supplies and equipment entered into by the Department of General 22 Services in which local governments may participate pursuant to 23 the provisions of section 2403(h) of The Administrative Code of 24 1929. The Deputy Secretary for Community Affairs and Development 25 shall be responsible for the administration of the center and 26 shall report in writing to the Governor [and Lieutenant 27 Governor] on the activities of the center. The center shall have 28 permanent staff both in its headquarters as well as in the 29 regional offices of the Governor and shall additionally make a toll-free telephone number available to local governments to 30

assist the center in accommodating requests for assistance.
 Funding for the center shall be provided by the department.
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4 Section 503. Committee membership.

The Local Government Advisory Committee shall consist of [the 5 6 Lieutenant Governor, who shall be the chairperson thereof, and] 7 fourteen [additional] members. Five members of the committee 8 shall be elected officials of local government appointed by the 9 Governor, representing, one each, the Pennsylvania State 10 Association of Boroughs, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors, the County Commissioners Association of 11 Pennsylvania, the Pennsylvania League of Cities and 12 13 Municipalities and the Pennsylvania State Association of 14 Township Commissioners. Each of these associations shall submit a list of three nominees to the Governor. The Governor shall 15 16 select one member from each list within 30 days of the receipt of such list, or else may request one or more associations to 17 18 submit, within 30 days, one substitute list. If an association 19 fails to submit a substitute list as requested by the Governor, 20 the Governor may appoint any member of that association at his or her discretion. Four members of the committee shall be 21 appointed by the Governor, and shall be representative of 22 23 persons or entities having an interest in the local affairs of 24 the Commonwealth, who may include, but are not necessarily 25 limited to, nonprofit organizations supporting local government 26 and members of the general public. One member of the committee 27 shall be a representative of the Pennsylvania Municipal 28 Authorities Association, appointed by the Governor. The four 29 remaining members shall be appointed, one each, by the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, 30

the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Minority
 Leader of the House of Representatives.

3 Section 505. Quorum and meetings.

4 The Local Government Advisory Committee shall meet at least 5 twice per year, as well as at the call of the Governor [or 6 Lieutenant Governor]. A majority of the members of the committee 7 shall constitute a quorum.

8 Section 506. Compensation and expenses.

9 (a) Compensation.--The members of the committee shall serve 10 without compensation. However, members [other than the 11 Lieutenant Governor] shall be entitled to receive traveling and 12 other reasonable expenses incurred in the discharge of their 13 official duties.

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Section 2. Upon the ratification of the amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania abolishing the office of Lieutenant Governor, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall cause the date of ratification to be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

19 Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:

(1) Section 1 of this act shall take effect upon
publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of the ratification
date of the amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania
that abolishes the office of Lieutenant Governor.

24 (2) Section 2 of this act and this section shall take25 effect immediately.
