## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the practice of professional nursing; providing for the licensing of nurses and for the revocation and suspension of such licenses, subject to appeal, and for their reinstatement; providing for the renewal of such licenses; regulating nursing in general; prescribing penalties and repealing certain laws," providing for delegation of functions necessary for the support of nursing services.
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 11 hereby enacts as follows:
- 12 Section 1. The act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), known
- 13 as The Professional Nursing Law, is amended by adding a section
- 14 to read:
- 15 Section 4.2. Delegation of Functions. -- (a) A registered
- 16 <u>nurse may delegate registered nursing functions to an individual</u>
- 17 carrying out functions necessary for the support of nursing
- 18 services if:
- 19 (1) The delegation is consistent with the standards of

- 1 acceptable nursing practice embraced by the nursing community in
- 2 this Commonwealth.
- 3 (2) The delegation is not prohibited by statute or
- 4 regulation, including regulations promulgated by the Board.
- 5 (b) Within two years of the effective date of this section,
- 6 the Board shall promulgate regulations which establish criteria
- 7 pursuant to which a registered nurse may delegate the
- 8 performance of nursing functions, preclude a registered nurse
- 9 from delegating the performance of certain types of nursing
- 10 functions or otherwise limit the ability of a registered nurse
- 11 to delegate nursing functions.
- 12 (c) A registered nurse shall be responsible for the
- 13 delegated nursing function in accordance with subsections (a)
- 14 and (b). A registered nurse's responsibility for the delegated
- 15 nursing function is not limited by any provisions of this
- 16 section.
- 17 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed as limiting
- 18 the authority of a physician to delegate functions within the
- 19 physician's scope of practice.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
