A RESOLUTION

1 Designating June 16, 2009, as "Motorcycle Day" in Pennsylvania.

2 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has a long history of motorsports of

4 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth has benefited economically from the

5 longtime investments of a range of corporations that are

6 involved in the production and engineering of the wide variety

7 of motorsport vehicles used today; and

8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is one of the top five states in the 9 United States in the number of licensed motorcyclists, with more

10 than 816,000, and registered motorcycles at 390,283; and

11 WHEREAS, Many people are purchasing motorcycles as a more 12 economic means of transportation, as well as for the fun and 13 excitement of the ride; and 1 WHEREAS, Motorcycles are important to jobs, and with its rich 2 history, the legislature should do everything it can to keep 3 motorcycle production in this Commonwealth; therefore be it 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June 5 16, 2009, as "Motorcycle Day" in Pennsylvania.
