A RESOLUTION

- 1 Condemning the punishment of women in this Commonwealth.
- 2 WHEREAS, Women around the world are victims of punishment
- 3 inflicted by family members, neighbors, acquaintances and
- 4 strangers; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Punishment of women manifests itself in many forms,
- 6 including isolation, flogging, caning, beating, mutilation,
- 7 amputation, acid burning, rape, honor killing and beheading; and
- 8 WHEREAS, These forms of punishment are a violation of
- 9 fundamental human rights; and
- 10 WHEREAS, A 2000 United Nations Population Fund study
- 11 estimated that 5,000 women are killed each year for dishonoring
- 12 their families; therefore be it
- 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives, serving as an

- 2 world, strongly condemn the punishment of women in this
- 3 Commonwealth.
