A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the month of September 2010 as "Prostate Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society reports that prostate
4	cancer is the most common type of cancer, other than skin
5	cancer, diagnosed among men in the nation and estimates that
6	217,730 new cases will occur in 2010, 9,800 of which will be in
7	this Commonwealth; and
8	WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society reports that prostate
9	cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among men in
10	the nation and will cause an estimated 32,050 deaths in 2010,
11	1,660 of which will be in this Commonwealth; and
12	WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society reports that this

Commonwealth is among the top five states with new cases in
2010; and

3 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that men have 4 a 1 in 6 chance of being diagnosed with prostate cancer in their 5 lifetime; and

6 WHEREAS, The risk of developing prostate cancer rises sharply 7 after age 50 and doubles every ten years thereafter; and 8 WHEREAS, Prostate cancer is twice as common among African-9 American men; and

10 WHEREAS, Early detection and screening for prostate cancer 11 are vital to combating the disease, especially for men more than 12 50 years of age, African-American men and men with a family 13 history of prostate cancer; and

14 WHEREAS, With early detection, the five-year relative 15 survival rate for men with localized prostate cancer is 100%; 16 and

WHEREAS, Greater public awareness and education about prostate cancer is necessary to help protect the health and welfare of men; therefore be it

20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 21 month of September 2010 as "Prostate Cancer Awareness Month" in 22 Pennsylvania and encourage all men to educate themselves about 23 the risk of prostate cancer.

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
