1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the payment of death benefits to the surviving spouse or children or parents of firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad members, law enforcement officers or National Guard members who die as a result of the performance of their duties," further providing for death benefit eligibility; and repealing certain provisions of the Municipal Police Pension Law and the Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard and Recovery Act.
10	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11	hereby enacts as follows:
12	Section 1. Section 1 of the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424,
13	No.101), referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement
14	Personnel Death Benefits Act, amended April 2, 2002 (P.L.213,
15	No.20), October 6, 2005 (P.L.319, No.59) and July 2, 2007 (P.L.
16	68, No.21), is amended to read:
17	Section 1. (a) In the event a law enforcement officer,
18	ambulance service or rescue squad member, firefighter, certified
19	hazardous material response team member or National Guard member

1 dies as a result of the performance of his duties, such 2 political subdivision, Commonwealth agency or, in the case of 3 National Guard members, the Adjutant General, <u>or, in the case of</u> 4 <u>a member of a Commonwealth law enforcement agency, the</u>

5 <u>authorized survivor or the agency head</u>, within [30] <u>90</u> days from 6 the date of death, shall submit certification of such death to 7 the Commonwealth.

8 (a.1) A firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad 9 member, law enforcement officer, certified hazardous material 10 response team member or National Guard member who suffers a 11 fatal heart attack or stroke while on duty or not later than 24 12 hours after participating in a physical training exercise or 13 responding to an emergency is presumed to have died as a result 14 of the performance of his duties for purposes of this act.

15 (b) A volunteer firefighter shall be deemed to be acting in 16 the performance of his duties for the purposes of this act going to or directly returning from a fire which the fire company or 17 18 fire department attended including travel from and direct return 19 to a firefighter's home, place of business or other place where 20 he or she shall have been when he or she received the call or alarm or while participating in instruction fire drills in which 21 the fire department or fire company shall have participated or 22 23 while repairing or doing other work about or on the fire 24 apparatus or buildings and grounds of the fire company or fire 25 department upon the authorization of the chief of the fire company or fire department or other person in charge or while 26 27 answering any emergency calls for any purpose or while riding 28 upon the fire apparatus which is owned or used by the fire 29 company or fire department or while performing any other duties 30 of such fire company or fire department as authorized by the

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1 municipality or while performing duties imposed by section 15, 2 act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.465, No.299), referred to as the Fire 3 and Panic Act.

(c) A volunteer ambulance service, certified hazardous 4 material response team or rescue squad member shall be deemed to 5 be acting in the performance of his duties for the purposes of 6 7 this act going to or directly returning from an emergency which 8 the ambulance service, certified hazardous material response team or rescue squad attended including travel from and direct 9 10 return to an ambulance service, certified hazardous material 11 response team or rescue squad member's home, place of business 12 or other place where he or she shall have been when he or she received the call or alarm or while participating in drills in 13 14 which the ambulance service, certified hazardous material 15 response team or rescue squad shall have participated or while 16 repairing or doing other work about or on any emergency vehicle or buildings and grounds of the ambulance service, certified 17 18 hazardous material response team or rescue squad upon the 19 authorization of the chief of the ambulance service, certified 20 hazardous material response team or rescue squad or other person in charge while answering any emergency calls for any purpose or 21 while riding upon any vehicles which are owned or used by the 22 23 ambulance service, certified hazardous material response team or 24 rescue squad.

(d) Upon receipt of such certification, the Commonwealth
shall, from moneys payable out of the General Fund, pay to the
[political subdivision] <u>surviving spouse or, if there is no</u>
<u>surviving spouse, to the minor children of the paid firefighter,</u>
<u>ambulance service or rescue squad member or law enforcement</u>
<u>officer who died as a result of the performance of his duty</u> the

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sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection (f) of 1 2 this section[. If the deceased was a member of a team organized 3 under a Commonwealth agency, the death benefit shall be paid to the Commonwealth agency instead of the political subdivision. 4 5 Within five days of receipt of said sum from the Commonwealth, the political subdivision or Commonwealth agency shall pay such 6 sum as a benefit to the surviving spouse, or if there is no 7 8 surviving spouse, to the minor children of the firefighter, 9 ambulance service member, certified hazardous material response 10 team member, rescue squad member or law enforcement officer who died as a result of the performance of his duty.], and an amount 11 equal to the monthly salary, adjusted in accordance with 12 13 subsection (f) of this section, of the deceased paid firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or law_ 14 enforcement officer, less any workers' compensation or pension 15 or retirement benefits paid to such survivors, and shall 16 continue such monthly payments until there is no eligible_ 17 18 beneficiary to receive them. For the purpose of this subsection, the term "eligible beneficiary" means the surviving spouse or_ 19 20 the child or children under the age of eighteen years or, if attending college, under the age of twenty-three years, of the 21 firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or law_ 22 23 enforcement officer who died as a result of the performance of 24 his duty. When no spouse or minor children survive, [the 25 benefit] a single sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with subsection (f) of this section, shall be paid to the parent or 26 parents of such firefighter, ambulance service member, certified 27 28 hazardous material response team member, rescue squad member or law enforcement officer. 29

30 (e) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall pay out of the

General Fund to the surviving spouse or, if there is no 1 2 surviving spouse, the minor children of a National Guard member, 3 [State police officer or other law enforcement officer of the Commonwealth] volunteer firefighter, ambulance service or rescue 4 squad member who died as a result of the performance of his 5 duties the sum of \$100,000, adjusted in accordance with 6 7 subsection (f) of this section. When no spouse or minor children 8 survive, the benefit shall be paid to the parent or parents of such National Guard member, [State police officer or other law 9 10 enforcement officer of the Commonwealth] volunteer firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member. The benefit shall be 11 payable whether or not the National Guard member or [officer] 12 13 volunteer firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member 14 died as a result of the performance of his duty within the 15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

16 On July 1, +2006, and each July 1 thereafter, the (f) Commonwealth shall adjust the level of the benefit payable 17 18 immediately before July 1 under subsections (d) and (e) of this 19 section to reflect the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, published by the United 20 States Department of Commerce, Bureau of Labor Statistics, 21 occurring in the one-year period ending on January 1 immediately 22 23 preceding July 1.

(g) A National Guard member shall be deemed to be acting inthe performance of his duties for the purposes of this act when:

(1) his death occurs in an official duty status
authorized under 51 Pa.C.S. § 508 (relating to active State
duty for emergency); or

30 Section 2. Repeals are as follows:
