AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, further providing for elk hunting licenses.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 2706.2 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania
- 6 Consolidated Statutes, is amended to read:
- 7 § 2706.2. Elk hunting licenses.
- 8 (a) Application limitation. -- Whenever the commission makes a
- 9 determination to authorize a hunting season for the taking of
- 10 elk, no person may submit more than one application for an elk
- 11 hunting license in any license year.
- 12 (b) License auction. -- The commission shall transfer one bull
- 13 elk tag by April 30, 2010, and by April 30 of each year
- 14 thereafter, to the Elk Tag Conservation Advisory Committee. The
- 15 <u>Elk Tag Conservation Advisory Committee</u> is authorized to <u>select</u>
- 16 <u>a wildlife conservation organization</u>, through an objective and
- 17 <u>established process, to</u> auction off a special license, <u>which</u>

- 1 <u>shall be known as the "Elk Conservation Tag,"</u> to hunters
- 2 interested in the opportunity to hunt one <u>bull</u> elk <u>in the next</u>
- 3 license year immediately following the transfer subject to the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) One license shall be auctioned annually. Nothing in
- 6 this subsection shall be construed to prevent a one-time
- 7 <u>transfer of the Elk Conservation Tag by the purchaser at</u>
- 8 <u>auction if the tag is transferred without consideration to</u>
- 9 <u>another properly licensed hunter for his use under the same</u>
- 10 terms and conditions as the original purchaser.
- 11 (2) The auction shall be open to residents and
 12 nonresidents of this Commonwealth.
- 13 (3) The [commission may, under 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I
- (relating to Commonwealth Procurement Code), contract with
- 15 <u>Elk Tag Conservation Advisory Committee shall, under</u>
- 16 <u>provisions set forth in this section, select</u> a wildlife
- 17 conservation organization to implement and conduct the
- 18 auction.
- 19 $\underline{\text{(3.1)}}$ The commission shall promulgate regulations for
- 20 the use of the <u>bull elk</u> license, remitting funds to the
- 21 commission and conduct of the auction.
- 22 (4) The contracted organization shall retain no more
- 23 than 20% of the proceeds from the auction. The contracted
- organization shall report annually to the commission on the
- use of the proceeds from the auction. The remaining proceeds
- from the auction shall be used by the commission for the elk
- 27 program in this Commonwealth in addition to any other funds
- available to the commission for that purpose. The commission
- 29 shall include in its annual report to the General Assembly
- 30 the use of all proceeds from the auction.

1	(5) All license fees shall be paid to the commission.
2	[(6) This subsection shall expire July 1, 2013.]
3	(c) Elk Tag Conservation Committee
4	(1) There is established in the commission the Elk Tag
5	Conservation Committee.
6	(2) The Elk Tag Conservation Committee shall consist of
7	the following members:
8	(i) One member appointed by the Governor.
9	(ii) One member appointed by the chairman of the
LO	Game and Fisheries Committee of the Senate.
11	(iii) One member appointed by the minority chairman
12	of the Game and Fisheries Committee of the Senate.
13	(iv) One member appointed by the chairman of the
L 4	Game and Fisheries Committee of the House of
L5	Representatives.
L 6	(v) One member appointed by the minority chairman of
17	the Game and Fisheries Committee of the House of
18	Representatives.
L 9	(3) The Governor's appointee shall serve as chairman of
20	the committee. Appointment of the initial members of the
21	committee shall occur by the later of April 1, 2010, or 15
22	days after the effective date of this subsection.
23	Appointments of members of subsequent committees shall occur
24	by April 1 of each even-numbered year.
25	(4) The term of members of the committee shall expire
26	upon the expiration of the final scheduled day of elk season
27	of every second year following their appointment.
28	(5) If a vacancy occurs in the committee, the appointing
29	authority who originally appointed the member whose seat has
2 (become recent shall appoint another member to the committee

1 to fill the vacancy. A member appointed to fill a vacancy

2 occurring prior to the expiration of a term shall serve the

3 unexpired term.

(6) The committee has the following duties:

criteria to evaluate each proposal received from wildlife conservation organizations in response to the request for proposals and to determine the most meritorious for elk conservation in this Commonwealth. The guidelines shall specify the relative importance of each individual factor in relation to the other factors. The guidelines shall be completed prior to the issuance of a request for proposals by the commission and submitted to the commission for inclusion in the request for proposal and for posting on the commission's publicly accessible Internet website. The committee may revise the guidelines annually prior to the issuance of the request for proposals.

- (ii) Select by majority vote the wildlife

 conservation organization to conduct the bull elk license

 auction from the proposals received by the commission

 from wildlife conservation organizations for the

 implementation and conduct of the auction in accordance

 with subsection (d).
- (7) The committee shall meet as frequently as it deems appropriate. A majority of the members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
- (8) The members of the committee shall serve without compensation.
- (d) Commission duties. -- The commission has the following

1	<u>duties:</u>
2	(1) Establish guidelines for the methods of providing
3	public notice of the issuance of requests for proposals,
4	including any of the following:
5	(i) Electronic publication which is accessible to
6	the general public.
7	(ii) Issuance of invitations for proposals to
8	wildlife conservation organizations from the commission's
9	solicitation mailing list.
10	(iii) Publication in a newspaper of general
11	circulation.
12	(iv) Issuance of invitations for proposals to any
13	wildlife conservation organizations that submitted a
14	proposal in the previous five years.
15	(v) Placement of the notification on the
16	commission's publicly accessible Internet website.
17	(2) Establish guidelines for the procedures and for
18	distribution of copies of requests for proposals and copies
19	of the committee's report to any interested person upon
20	request. This paragraph includes the imposition of a fee to
21	reimburse the committee for the costs of reproduction and
22	postage. Copies of requests for proposals shall not be
23	available for distribution until after the close of the
24	period for the submission of the proposals as determined by
25	the request for proposals.
26	(3) Following the establishment of selection criteria by
27	the committee under subsection (c)(6)(i), issue a request for
28	proposals in accordance with 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I (relating to
29	Commonwealth Procurement Code) for the implementation and

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conduct of the auction. The request for proposals shall

1	include all of the following:
2	(i) A requirement that the selected wildlife
3	conservation organization shall publicize or cause to be
4	publicized the time, date and procedure for the auction.
5	(ii) A requirement that the selected wildlife
6	conservation organization comply with all applicable
7	regulations promulgated by the commission.
8	(iii) Requirements regarding the time and date and
9	the required format for the submission of a proposal by
10	wildlife conservation organizations.
11	(iv) A notification that a proposal received from a
12	wildlife conservation organization shall not be
13	considered by the committee when the wildlife
14	conservation organization was selected to conduct the
15	auction in the previous year unless the committee
16	receives only one proposal in response to the request for
17	proposals.
18	(4) Receive the proposals submitted by wildlife
19	conservation organizations in response to the request for
20	proposals and submit the unopened proposals to the committee.
21	(5) Enter into a contract under 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I with
22	the wildlife conservation organization selected by the
23	committee to implement and conduct the auction under
24	subsection (c).
25	(6) Post public notices of the issuance of requests for
26	proposals on its publicly accessible Internet website.
27	(7) Provide the committee with adequate staff,
28	administrative support and resources, as necessary, to
29	perform its duties under this section.
30	(e) Wildlife conservation organizations A wildlife

- 1 conservation organization shall submit a proposal to the request
- 2 for proposals to the commission in a timely manner as to allow
- 3 its receipt prior to the closure of the period for submission of
- 4 the proposal as established in the request for proposals.
- 5 (f) Opening of proposals, selection by committee and
- 6 <u>distribution of report.--</u>
- 7 (1) The committee shall open the unopened proposals as
- 8 <u>received from the commission in a manner as to prevent the</u>
- 9 <u>disclosure of their contents to competing wildlife</u>
- 10 conservation organizations.
- 11 (2) The committee shall comply with the criteria
- 12 <u>established in subsection (c)(6)(i) in selecting a wildlife</u>
- conservation organization to conduct the auction.
- 14 (3) The committee shall prepare and submit to the
- commission a written report that states the reasons for the
- 16 <u>selection of the wildlife conservation organization to</u>
- 17 receive the award of the contract. In addition, the report
- shall describe how the selection complies with the selection
- 19 criteria.
- 20 (4) No wildlife conservation organization shall be
- 21 selected to conduct the auction in any two consecutive years
- 22 unless the committee receives only one proposal in response
- 23 to the request for proposals and that proposal meets the
- quidelines established in subsection (c) (6) (i).
- 25 (5) Copies of the report shall be available to the
- 26 public upon request and available from the commission in
- 27 <u>accordance with the distribution guidelines established under</u>
- subsection (d)(2).
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
