12	Section 1902-A. Powers and Duties of State Board of
13	Education(a) The State Board of Education shall have the
14	power, and its duty shall be:
15	(1) To adopt such policies, standards, rules and regulations
16	formulated by the Council of Higher Education, as may be
17	necessary to provide for the establishment, operation and
18	maintenance of community colleges, including minimum
19	requirements for physical facilities and equipment, curriculum,
20	faculty, standards and professional requirements, qualifications

1 for admission and advancement of students, student enrollment, student population of the area to be served by the community 2 college, requirements for satisfactory completion of a two-year 3 program and the degrees or diplomas or certificates to be 4 awarded therefor, means of financing and financial resources for 5 the establishment and support of the community college, and all 6 matters necessary to effectuate the purposes of this act. 7 Regulations adopted under this clause shall set forth minimum 8 9 standards that community colleges shall adhere to in providing their facilities for use by community groups and for other_ 10 11 public purposes. * * * 12

13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
