AN ACT

1	Amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), entitled
2	"An act providing for planning for the processing and
3	disposal of municipal waste; requiring counties to submit
4	plans for municipal waste management systems within their
5	boundaries; authorizing grants to counties and municipalities
6	for planning, resource recovery and recycling; imposing and
7	collecting fees; establishing certain rights for host
8	municipalities; requiring municipalities to implement
9	recycling programs; requiring Commonwealth agencies to
10	procure recycled materials; imposing duties; granting powers
11	to counties and municipalities; authorizing the Environmental
12	Quality Board to adopt regulations; authorizing the
13	Department of Environmental Resources to implement this act;
14	providing remedies; prescribing penalties; establishing a
15	fund; and making repeals," in recycling and waste reduction,
16	further providing for recycling at educational institutions.
17	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
18	hereby enacts as follows:
19	Section 1. Section 1509 of the act of July 28, 1988
20	(P.L.556, No.101), known as the Municipal Waste Planning,
21	Recycling and Waste Reduction Act, is amended to read:
22	Section 1509. Recycling at educational institutions.
23	(a) General ruleThe department, in consultation with the

1 Department of Education, shall develop guidelines for source 2 separation and collection of recyclable materials and for waste 3 reduction in primary and secondary schools, colleges and universities, whether the schools, colleges and universities are 4 public or nonpublic. At a minimum, the quidelines shall address 5 materials generated in administrative offices, classrooms, 6 7 dormitories and cafeterias. The Department of Education shall 8 distribute these guidelines and encourage their implementation. 9 The guidelines shall be developed and distributed within two 10 years of the effective date of this act, except that the quidelines are not required to be distributed to educational 11 12 institutions that are Commonwealth agencies implementing 13 recycling programs under section 1505.

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(b) Textbooks and other books.--

15 (1) Public and nonpublic primary and secondary schools and institutions of the State System of Higher Education 16 17 shall use certified textbook recycling facilities for the 18 collection and recycling of textbooks and other books that 19 are to be discarded. 20 (2) The Department of General Services shall promulgate regulations for implementation of THE CERTIFICATION OF 21 22 TEXTBOOK RECYCLING FACILITIES UNDER this subsection. The 23 regulations shall require compliance no earlier than the end 24 of the school year which occurs after the effective date of 25 the regulations. 26 (3) The Department of General Services shall certify and 27 may contract with a facility OR FACILITIES to recycle textbooks and other books for a MINIMUM three-year period. 28 29 The Department of General Services may suspend the contract

30 if at any point during the period the facility fails to meet

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1	the qualifications for certification.
2	(4) In order to be certified by the Department of
3	General Services and prior to entering into a contract with
4	the Department of General Services under this subsection, a
5	textbook recycling facility must satisfy the following
6	<u>conditions:</u>
7	(i) The facility may not dispose of textbooks and
8	other books at landfills or resource recovery facilities.
9	(ii) The facility must monetarily compensate the
10	schools and institutions required to comply with this
11	subsection for the textbooks and other books it accepts
12	for recycling AND FOR ANY COSTS THAT THE SCHOOLS OR
13	INSTITUTIONS INCUR TO TRANSPORT, STORE OR SHIP THE
14	TEXTBOOKS AND OTHER BOOKS TO BE RECYCLED.
15	(iii) The facility must have adequate facilities in
16	this Commonwealth to store and ship the textbooks and
17	other books for recycling.
18	(iv) The facility must employ not less than 50% of
19	its personnel in this Commonwealth AND MAY APPLY TO THE
20	DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES FOR A WAIVER OF THIS
21	<u>REQUIREMENT.</u>
22	(v) The facility must ensure that all discarded
23	textbooks and other books are used in the development of
24	renewable energy resources or redistributed for
25	educational purposes.
26	(vi) Other provisions determined to be necessary by
27	the Department of General Services.
28	(5) A school or institution subject to the requirements
29	of this subsection shall be deemed to be in compliance with
30	the provisions of this subsection or the regulations

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1	promulgated under this subsection for textbooks and other
2	books if the school or institution:
3	(i) offers the textbooks and other books for
4	recycling to one or more certified textbook recycling
5	facilities and each facility that received the offer
6	cannot comply with paragraph (4)(ii); or
7	(ii) provides the textbooks and other books to other
8	schools or institutions or charitable organizations for
9	educational purposes.
10	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
