1 2 3 4 5 6	Urging the Governor and the General Assembly to institute a mobilization strategy to manage funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE GOVERNOR TO INSTITUTE A BROADBAND MOBILIZATION STRATEGY TO MANAGE FUNDS FROM THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009.
7	WHEREAS, With the passage of the American Recovery and
8	Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public Law 111-5, 123 Stat. 115), many
9	states are coordinating large, cross-agency, statewide-
0 ـ	strategies to maximize their American Recovery and Reinvestment
1	Act of 2009 funding opportunities. For instance, the highly
.2	publicized California Broadband Initiative is seeking-
.3	\$1,000,000,000 of the \$7,200,000,000 American Recovery and
4	Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds; and
.5	WHEREAS, Because the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act
6	of 2009 will be hyper-competitive, the Commonwealth must put-
_7	forth a broad strategy that leverages and combines American
8 .	Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 opportunities and non-
9	American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 opportunities;

1	WHEREAS, To best maximize this Commonwealth's share of
2	American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds, the
3	strategy must be cross industry, cross agency, transparent and
4	nonpartisan as it leverages all opportunities with existing-
5	Federal, State, local and corporate resources; and
6	WHEREAS, The strategy should follow the following principles:
7	(1) Providing broadband leadership at the State level,
8	rather than a local "free for all."
9	(2) Leveraging existing public and private
10	infrastructure.
11	(3) Developing competitive bid processes.
12	(4) Providing appropriate incentives for investment in
13	underserved and unserved regions.
14	(5) Linking with proven existing programs.
15	(6) Focusing on the "last mile" for connecting
16	residential broadband customers.
17	(7) Stimulating demand through anchor tenants: schools,
18	hospitals, other community anchors.
19	(8) Replicating the public private partnership used
20	successfully in other states, such as California.
21	(9) Updating, with real time data, broadband mapping and
22	insisting on data transparency.
23	(10) Establishing meaningful reports and accountability
24	for all projects.
25	(11) Investing in state-of-the-art infrastructure.
26	(12) Ensuring that all projects receiving stimulus money
27	have proven, identified sustainability plans after the
28	stimulus money is used.
29	(13) Addressing public safety improvements through
30	broadband deployment.

- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 urge the Governor to join with the General Assembly to institute
- 5 a mobilization strategy to manage funds from the American
- 6 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Congressional delegation from Pennsylvania
- 8 be encouraged to seek to have Federal agencies block grant all
- 9 nonformula funding to the states.
- 10 WHEREAS, WITH THE PASSAGE OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND
- 11 REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009 (PUBLIC LAW 111-5, 123 STAT. 115), MANY
- 12 STATES ARE COORDINATING LARGE, CROSS-AGENCY, STATEWIDE
- 13 STRATEGIES TO ENHANCE THEIR AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT
- 14 ACT OF 2009 FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES IN ORDER TO MAXIMIZE BROADBAND
- 15 DEPLOYMENT STRATEGIES; AND
- 16 WHEREAS, BECAUSE THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT
- 17 OF 2009 WILL BE COMPETITIVE, THE COMMONWEALTH MUST PUT FORTH A
- 18 BROAD STRATEGY THAT LEVERAGES AND COMBINES AMERICAN RECOVERY AND
- 19 REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009 OPPORTUNITIES AND ALL OTHER AVAILABLE
- 20 ECONOMIC RESOURCES TO PROMOTE SOUND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR THE
- 21 DEPLOYMENT OF BROADBAND ACCESS; AND
- 22 WHEREAS, TO BEST MAXIMIZE THIS COMMONWEALTH'S SHARE OF
- 23 AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009 FUNDS, THE
- 24 STRATEGY MUST BE TRANSPARENT AND NONPARTISAN AS IT LEVERAGES ALL
- 25 OPPORTUNITIES WITH EXISTING FEDERAL, STATE, LOCAL AND CORPORATE
- 26 RESOURCES; AND
- 27 WHEREAS, THE STRATEGY SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES:
- 28 (1) PROVIDE BROADBAND LEADERSHIP AT THE STATE LEVEL,
- 29 THROUGH A DECENTRALIZED SYSTEM THAT PROMOTES PENNSYLVANIA AS
- 30 A WHOLE, MUCH LIKE THE HIGHLY PUBLICIZED CALIFORNIA BROADBAND

- 1 INITIATIVE WHICH IS SEEKING \$1,000,000,000 OF THE
- 2 \$7,200,000,000 AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009
- 3 FUNDS.
- 4 (2) LEVERAGE EXISTING PUBLIC AND PRIVATE INFRASTRUCTURE.
- 5 (3) DEVELOP COMPETITIVE BID PROCESSES.
- 6 (4) ADDRESS PUBLIC SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS THROUGH BROADBAND
- 7 DEPLOYMENT.
- 8 (5) PROVIDE APPROPRIATE INCENTIVES FOR INVESTMENT IN
- 9 UNDERSERVED AND UNSERVED REGIONS.
- 10 (6) LINK WITH PROVEN EXISTING PROGRAMS AND STIMULATING
- 11 DEMAND THROUGH ANCHOR TENANTS, SCHOOLS, HOSPITALS AND OTHER
- 12 COMMUNITY ANCHORS.
- 13 (7) FOCUS ON THE FINAL LEG OF DELIVERING SERVICES TO A
- 14 CUSTOMER ("LAST MILE") FOR CONNECTING RESIDENTIAL BROADBAND
- 15 CUSTOMERS.
- 16 (8) UPDATE BROADBAND MAPPING THAT IS DELIVERED
- 17 IMMEDIATELY AFTER COLLECTION ("REAL-TIME DATA") AND INSISTING
- 18 ON DATA TRANSPARENCY.
- 19 (9) ESTABLISH MEANINGFUL REPORTS AND ACCOUNTABILITY FOR
- 20 ALL PROJECTS.
- 21 (10) INVEST IN STATE-OF-THE-ART INFRASTRUCTURE.
- 22 (11) ENSURE THAT ALL PROJECTS RECEIVING STIMULUS MONEY
- 23 HAVE PROVEN, IDENTIFIED SUSTAINABILITY PLANS AFTER THE
- 24 STIMULUS MONEY IS USED;
- 25 THEREFORE BE IT
- 26 RESOLVED, THAT THE SENATE OF PENNSYLVANIA URGE THE PRESIDENT
- 27 OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE GOVERNOR TO WORK IN CONJUNCTION
- 28 WITH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO INSTITUTE A BROADBAND MOBILIZATION
- 29 STRATEGY TO MANAGE FUNDS FROM THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND
- 30 REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009; AND BE IT FURTHER

- 1 RESOLVED, THAT COPIES OF THIS RESOLUTION BE TRANSMITTED TO
- 2 THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE GOVERNOR OF THE
- 3 COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA.
