## AN ACT

- Providing for municipal volunteer fire company, volunteer ambulance service and volunteer rescue company service incentives.
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- 1 Section 503. Certification.
- 2 Chapter 30. Miscellaneous Provisions
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- 4 Section 3002. Effective date.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 1
- 8 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS
- 9 Section 101. Short title.
- 10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Municipal
- 11 Volunteers of Fire Companies, Ambulance Services and Rescue
- 12 Companies Incentive Act.
- 13 Section 102. Purpose.
- 14 The purpose of this act is to authorize municipalities to
- 15 enact a tax credit against an active volunteer's earned income
- 16 and property tax liability as a financial incentive to:
- 17 (1) Indicate the municipality's acknowledgment of the
- value of and the absence of any public cost for volunteer
- 19 fire protection and ambulance and rescue services provided by
- 20 active volunteers.
- 21 (2) To encourage other individuals to newly volunteer or
- for former volunteers to consider rejoining as active
- volunteers in a volunteer fire company, ambulance service or
- 24 rescue company.
- 25 Section 103. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 27 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 28 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 29 "Active volunteer." A volunteer for a volunteer fire
- 30 company, volunteer ambulance service or volunteer rescue company

- 1 who has complied with the requirements of the volunteer service
- 2 credit program and who is certified under section 503.
- 3 "Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner of the
- 4 Commonwealth.
- 5 "Department." The Department of Revenue of the Commonwealth.
- 6 "Earned income tax." A tax on earned income and net profits
- 7 levied under chapter 3 of the act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.
- 8 1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
- 9 "Governing body." A city council, borough council,
- 10 incorporated town council, board of township commissioners,
- 11 board of township supervisors, governing council of a home rule
- 12 municipality or optional plan municipality or a governing
- 13 council of any similar purpose government which may be created
- 14 by statute after the effective date of this section.
- "Local Tax Enabling Act." The act of December 31, 1965 (P.L.
- 16 1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
- 17 "Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town or
- 18 township located in this Commonwealth.
- "Tax credit." The tax credit granted under section 301 or
- 20 302.1.
- "Volunteer." A member of a volunteer fire company, volunteer
- 22 ambulance service or volunteer rescue company.
- "Volunteer ambulance service." Any nonprofit chartered
- 24 corporation, association or organization located in this
- 25 Commonwealth, which is licensed by the Department of Health and
- 26 is not associated or affiliated with any hospital and which is
- 27 regularly engaged in the provision of emergency medical
- 28 services, including basic life support or advanced life support
- 29 services and advanced life support squads as defined in 28 Pa.
- 30 Code § 1005.1 (relating to general provisions). The term shall

- 1 not include any corporation, association or organization that is
- 2 primarily engaged in the operation of invalid coaches which are
- 3 intended for the routine transport of persons who are
- 4 convalescent or otherwise nonambulatory and do not ordinarily
- 5 require emergency medical treatment while in transit.
- 6 "Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation,
- 7 association or organization located in this Commonwealth that
- 8 provides fire protection services and may offer other voluntary
- 9 emergency services within this Commonwealth.
- 10 "Volunteer rescue company." A nonprofit chartered
- 11 corporation, association or organization located in this
- 12 Commonwealth that provides rescue services as part of the
- 13 response to fires and/or vehicle accidents within this
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 "Volunteer service credit program." The program established
- 16 under section 501 to determine the active status of a volunteer.
- 17 CHAPTER 3
- 18 MUNICIPAL TAX CREDIT
- 19 Section 301. Program authorization.
- 20 (a) Establishment. -- A municipality that levies an earned
- 21 income tax may establish by ordinance a tax credit against an
- 22 individual's liability imposed under chapter 3 of the Local Tax
- 23 Enabling Act for active service as a volunteer.
- 24 (b) Amount. -- A municipality must set forth in the ordinance
- 25 the amount of the tax credit. If the total earned income tax
- 26 liability is less than the amount established by the
- 27 municipality, the tax credit shall equal the remaining tax
- 28 liability.
- 29 (c) Public notice. -- At least 30 days prior to adoption of
- 30 the ordinance, the governing body of a municipality shall give

- 1 public notice of its intent to adopt an ordinance to establish a
- 2 tax credit and conduct at least one public hearing on the issue.
- 3 (d) Specific notice. -- A municipality that establishes a tax
- 4 credit under subsection (a) shall notify the commissioner in the
- 5 manner and pursuant to any schedule prescribed by the
- 6 commissioner.
- 7 Section 302. Claim.
- 8 (a) Eliqibility.--An individual who satisfies all of the
- 9 following criteria may claim a tax credit established under
- 10 section 301:
- 11 (1) The individual is subject to an earned income tax
- imposed by a municipality that has established a tax credit
- under section 301.
- 14 (2) The individual is certified under section 503.
- 15 (b) Return.--A husband or wife may claim any tax credit
- 16 provided for under this act when filing a joint return. The tax
- 17 return form shall provide a mechanism for separating the
- 18 liability of an individual for any earned income tax imposed by
- 19 the school district of residence from the liability of an
- 20 individual for any earned income tax imposed by the municipality
- 21 so that the tax credit may be applied against the individual's
- 22 liability for taxes imposed by the municipality.
- 23 Section 302.1. Real property tax credit.
- 24 The governing body of a school district may provide, by
- 25 ordinance, for a tax credit against real property taxes to be
- 26 granted to active volunteer firefighters. The tax credit shall
- 27 apply to taxes levied on residential real property owned and
- 28 occupied by an active volunteer firefighter who is certified
- 29 under section 503. The amount of the tax credit shall be
- 30 equivalent to no more than 20% of the tax liability of the

- 1 active volunteer firefighter.
- 2 Section 303. Limitations.
- 3 A tax credit established under this act may be used against
- 4 only the individual's earned income tax or property tax
- 5 liability for the current taxable year.
- 6 CHAPTER 5
- 7 VOLUNTEER SERVICE CREDIT
- 8 Section 501. Volunteer service credit program.
- 9 (a) Establishment.--Within 90 days of the effective date of
- 10 this section, the commissioner shall establish a volunteer
- 11 service credit program that establishes the annual requirements
- 12 for the designation of a volunteer in active service at a
- 13 volunteer fire company, volunteer ambulance service or volunteer
- 14 rescue company.
- 15 (b) Activities. -- The volunteer service credit system shall
- 16 consider the following activities in determining credit toward a
- 17 designation of active service:
- 18 (1) The number of emergency calls to which a volunteer
- 19 responds.
- 20 (2) The level of training and participation in formal
- 21 training and drills for a volunteer.
- 22 (3) The total amount of time expended by a volunteer on
- 23 administrative and other support services, including
- fundraising and facility or equipment maintenance.
- 25 (4) The involvement in other events or projects that aid
- the financial viability, emergency response or operational
- 27 readiness of a volunteer fire company, volunteer ambulance
- 28 service or volunteer rescue company.
- 29 (c) Guidelines. -- The commissioner shall adopt guidelines,
- 30 including forms, necessary to implement this section.

- 1 Section 502. Service record.
- 2 (a) Log. -- The chief of a volunteer fire company, the
- 3 supervisor or chief of a volunteer ambulance service or
- 4 volunteer rescue company or their designees shall establish and
- 5 maintain a service log that documents the activities of each
- 6 volunteer that qualifies for credit toward active service under
- 7 the volunteer service credit system and the calculation of the
- 8 total credits earned for each volunteer in the volunteer fire
- 9 company, volunteer ambulance service or volunteer rescue
- 10 company.
- 11 (b) Review.--Service logs established and maintained by
- 12 volunteer fire companies, volunteer ambulance services or
- 13 volunteer rescue companies shall be subject to periodic review
- 14 by the Auditor General, the department, the governing body of
- 15 the municipality where the volunteer fire company, volunteer
- 16 ambulance service or volunteer rescue company is located and the
- 17 governing body of a municipality where the volunteer fire
- 18 company, volunteer ambulance service or volunteer rescue company
- 19 provides services.
- 20 Section 503. Certification.
- 21 (a) Self-certification. -- The active volunteer shall sign and
- 22 submit the application to the chief of the volunteer fire
- 23 company or the supervisor or chief of the volunteer ambulance
- 24 service or volunteer rescue company where the volunteer serves.
- 25 (b) Local sign-off.--The chief and another officer of the
- 26 volunteer fire company, the supervisor or chief and another
- 27 officer of the volunteer ambulance service or volunteer rescue
- 28 company shall sign the application attesting to the individual's
- 29 status as an active volunteer. The application shall then be
- 30 forwarded to the municipality for final review and processing.

1 CHAPTER 30

2 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 3 Section 3001. Penalties for false reporting.
- 4 The following shall apply:
- 5 (1) Any person who knowingly makes or conspires to make
- a false service record report under this act to the
- 7 commissioner commits a misdemeanor of the first degree
- 8 punishable by a fine of \$2,500.
- 9 (2) Any person who knowingly provides or conspires to
- 10 provide false information that is used to compile a service
- 11 record report under this act commits a misdemeanor of the
- first degree punishable by a fine of \$2,500.
- 13 Section 3002. Effective date.
- 14 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
