- 5 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 7 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 <u>"Smuggling of human beings."</u> Transportation, procurement of
- 9 transportation or use of property or real property by a person
- 10 or an entity knowing, or having reason to know, that the person

11 or persons transported or to be transported are unlawfully

12 present in the United States in violation of law.

- 13 <u>§ 3022.</u> Smuggling of human beings.
- 14 (a) General rule. -- A person who intentionally engages in the

15 smuggling of human beings for profit or other commercial purpose

- 16 commits a felony of the third degree.
- 17 (b) Lawful stop.--Notwithstanding any other law, a law
- 18 enforcement officer engaged in the enforcement of this section
- 19 may lawfully stop a person who is operating a motor vehicle if
- 20 the officer has reasonable suspicion to believe that the person
- 21 is in violation of any provision of 75 Pa.C.S. (relating to

22 <u>vehicles).</u>

23 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
