1 2 3	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth services, providing for volunteer emergency response personnel.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 7309. Volunteer emergency response personnel.</u>
9	(a) Emergency assignments
10	(1) Employees who are volunteer health or emergency
11	response personnel are entitled to a leave of absence from
12	their respective duties without loss of time or efficiency
13	rating on all days they are engaged in a declared emergency
14	response.
15	(2) Any person whose employment with an employer is
16	interrupted by a period of service as a member of volunteer

1	health or emergency response personnel shall be permitted,
2	upon request of that person, to use during such period of
3	service any vacation, annual or similar leave with pay
4	accrued by the person before the commencement of such
5	service. No employer may require any such person to use
6	vacation, annual or similar leave during such period of
7	service.
8	(b) Requirements
9	(1) Employees who are volunteers must be members of a
10	bona fide health or emergency response organization
11	recognized by the Department of Health or the agency.
12	(2) The organization or employee must be acting under a
13	declared emergency by the Federal, State or local government,
14	and all persons must be deemed responding under the
15	operational control of the requesting Federal, State or local
16	government.
17	(3) It shall be the responsibility of the employee to

3 (c) Discretionary leave.--Nothing in this section shall be

4 construed to prohibit employers from providing paid leave or

5 other compensation or continued medical and other benefits to an

6 <u>employee requesting a leave of absence under this section or for</u>

7 any days in excess of those provided in subsection (b).

8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
