AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 19, 1988 (P.L.1262, No.156), 1 entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the licensing of 2 eligible organizations to conduct games of chance, for the licensing of persons to distribute games of chance, for the registration of manufacturers of games of chance, and for 5 suspensions and revocations of licenses and permits; 6 requiring records; providing for local referendum by 7 electorate; and prescribing penalties," further providing for definitions, for prize limits and for special permits 9 relating to card game contests. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

- 13 Section 1. The definition of "games of chance" in section 3
- of the act of December 19, 1988 (P.L.1262, No.156), known as the 14
- 15 Local Option Small Games of Chance Act, amended October 18, 2000
- 16 (P.L.602, No.79), is amended and the section is amended by
- 17 adding a definition to read:
- 18 Section 3. Definitions.
- 19 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 20 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 21 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 * * *
- 2 "Card game contest." A card game that is conducted with
- 3 multiple rounds of play of a specified number of hands for each
- 4 round and completed within a period not to exceed 24 hours, in
- 5 which:
- 6 (1) A player's bet must stay within the minimum and
- 7 maximum bet allowed at the table.
- 8 (2) A player is eliminated from the card game so
- 9 conducted if:
- 10 (i) the player loses all of the player's chips;
- 11 (ii) the player does not have enough chips to meet
- the required minimum bet; or
- 13 <u>(iii) the player has the fewest chips after a</u>
- 14 <u>certain number of hands are played.</u>
- 15 (3) The winner of the card game so conducted is:
- 16 <u>(i) the last player at the table; or</u>
- 17 (ii) the player with the most chips after a certain
- specified number of rounds are played.

- "Games of chance." Punchboards, daily drawings, weekly
- 21 drawings, raffles and pull-tabs, as defined in this act,
- 22 provided that no such game shall be played by or with the
- 23 assistance of any mechanical or electrical devices or media
- 24 other than a dispensing machine or passive selection device and
- 25 further provided that the particular chance taken by any person
- 26 in any such game shall not be made contingent upon any other
- 27 occurrence or the winning of any other contest, but shall be
- 28 determined solely at the discretion of the purchaser. This
- 29 definition includes a card game contest. This definition shall
- 30 not be construed to authorize any other form of gambling

- 1 currently prohibited under any provision of Title 18 of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to crimes and
- 3 offenses). Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize
- 4 games commonly known as "slot machines" or "video poker."

- 6 Section 2. Section 5 of the act is amended by adding a
- 7 subsection to read:
- 8 Section 5. Prize limits.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (i) Card game contest limits. -- Notwithstanding any other
- 11 provision of this act to the contrary, the maximum cash value
- 12 which may be awarded for any single card game in a card game
- 13 contest shall be \$500.
- 14 Section 3. Section 11 of the act, amended December 19, 1990
- 15 (P.L.812, No.195), is amended to read:
- 16 Section 11. Special permits.
- 17 (a) Issuance and fee.--
- 18 (1) The licensing authority shall issue a special permit
- for each raffle in which the licensee proposes to award
- individual prizes having a cash value in excess of \$500.
- 21 (2) The licensing authority shall issue a special permit
- for each card game contest which the licensee proposes to
- conduct.
- 24 (3) The licensing authority may establish and collect a
- fee not to exceed \$25 for the issuance of special permits
- 26 under this section.
- 27 (b) Permit application.--
- 28 <u>(1)</u> Each [special permit] application <u>submitted for a</u>
- 29 <u>special permit under subsection (a)(1)</u> shall specify the
- 30 location where the actual drawing will be held, the number of

- chances to be sold, the price per chance and the cash value
- of the prize or prizes to be awarded.
- 3 (2) Each application submitted for a special permit
- 4 <u>under subsection (a) (2) shall specify the location where the</u>
- 5 <u>card game contest will be conducted, the number of persons to</u>
- 6 <u>be admitted for the card game contest and all of the house</u>
- 7 rules to be used.
- 8 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
