AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, further providing for elk hunting licenses.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 2706.2 of Title 34 of the Pennsylvania
- 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 7 § 2706.2. Elk hunting licenses.
- 8 (a) Application limitation.--Whenever the commission makes a
- 9 determination to authorize a hunting season for the taking of
- 10 elk, no person may submit more than one application for an elk
- 11 hunting license in any license year.
- 12 (b) License auction. -- The commission shall transfer one bull
- 13 elk tag by April 30, 2012, and by April 30 of each year
- 14 thereafter, to the Elk Tag Conservation Advisory Committee. The
- 15 <u>Elk Tag Conservation Advisory Committee</u> is authorized to <u>select</u>
- 16 a wildlife conservation organization, through an objective and
- 17 <u>established process, to</u> auction off a special license, <u>which</u>

- 1 <u>shall be known as the "Elk Conservation Tag,"</u> to hunters
- 2 interested in the opportunity to hunt one <u>bull</u> elk <u>in the next</u>
- 3 license year immediately following the transfer subject to the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) One license shall be auctioned annually. Nothing in
- 6 this subsection shall be construed to prevent a one-time
- 7 transfer of the Elk Conservation Tag by the purchaser at
- 8 auction if the tag is transferred without consideration to
- 9 <u>another properly licensed hunter for his use under the same</u>
- 10 <u>terms and conditions as the original purchaser.</u>
- 11 (2) The auction shall be open to residents and
- 12 nonresidents of this Commonwealth.
- 13 (3) The [commission may, under 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I
- 14 (relating to Commonwealth Procurement Code), contract with]
- 15 <u>Elk Tag Conservation Advisory Committee shall, under</u>
- 16 provisions set forth in this section, select a wildlife
- 17 conservation organization to implement and conduct the
- 18 auction. The commission shall promulgate regulations for the
- 19 use of the <u>bull elk</u> license, remitting funds to the
- 20 commission and conduct of the auction.
- 21 (4) The contracted organization shall retain no more
- 22 than 20% of the proceeds from the auction. The contracted
- organization shall report annually to the commission on the
- use of the proceeds from the auction. The remaining proceeds
- from the auction shall be used by the commission for the elk
- 26 program in this Commonwealth in addition to any other funds
- 27 available to the commission for that purpose. The commission
- shall include in its annual report to the General Assembly
- 29 the use of all proceeds from the auction.
- 30 (5) All license fees shall be paid to the commission.

- 1 [(6) This subsection shall expire July 1, 2013.]
- 2 (c) Establishment of advisory committee.--There is
- 3 established an advisory committee to be known as the Elk Tag
- 4 <u>Conservation Advisory Committee.</u>
- 5 (d) Members of advisory committee. -- The advisory committee
- 6 shall consist of five members, one of whom is to be appointed by
- 7 <u>each of the following: the Governor, the chairman and minority</u>
- 8 <u>chairman of the Game and Fisheries Committee of the Senate and</u>
- 9 the chairman and minority chairman of the Game and Fisheries
- 10 Committee of the House of Representatives. The Governor's
- 11 appointee shall serve as chairman of the advisory committee.
- 12 Appointment of the initial members of the advisory committee
- 13 shall occur no later than April 1, 2012, or 15 days after the
- 14 <u>enactment of this subsection</u>, whichever is later. Appointments
- 15 <u>of members of subsequent advisory committees shall occur no</u>
- 16 <u>later than April 1 of each even-numbered year subsequent to</u>
- 17 2012.
- 18 (e) Term of advisory committee members.--The term of members
- 19 of the advisory committee shall expire upon the expiration of
- 20 the final scheduled day of elk season of every second year
- 21 following their appointment.
- 22 (f) Vacancy in advisory committee. -- Whenever a vacancy shall
- 23 occur in the advisory committee, the appointing authority who
- 24 appointed the member whose absence created the vacancy shall
- 25 appoint another member to the committee to fill such vacancy for
- 26 the remainder of the term.
- 27 (g) Reimbursement. -- The advisory committee members shall
- 28 serve without compensation.
- 29 (h) Request for proposals from wildlife conservation
- 30 organizations. -- The advisory committee shall request proposals

- 1 from wildlife conservation organizations in the manner as
- 2 provided by law.
- 3 (i) Selection. -- Based on submitted proposals, by majority
- 4 vote, the advisory committee shall select the wildlife
- 5 <u>conservation organization to conduct the auction. No wildlife</u>
- 6 conservation organization shall be chosen to conduct the auction
- 7 <u>in any two consecutive years.</u>
- 8 (j) Responsibility to publicize. -- The selected wildlife
- 9 conservation organization shall be responsible for publicizing
- 10 or causing to be publicized the time, date and procedure for the
- 11 auction. These details shall be included in the bid submitted to
- 12 the advisory committee and shall be considered by the advisory
- 13 <u>committee in the selection of the wildlife conservation</u>
- 14 organization. The auction shall occur on a date that will
- 15 provide reasonable time before the commencement of the elk
- 16 <u>season for which the tag is to be used for the winner to make</u>
- 17 payment and take custody of the tag.
- 18 (k) Request for proposals.--Proposals shall be solicited
- 19 through a request for proposals. Adequate public notice of the
- 20 request for proposals shall be given a reasonable time prior to
- 21 the date set for the opening of proposals. The advisory
- 22 committee shall establish written policies regarding methods of
- 23 public notice. The method of public notice may include any of
- 24 the following:
- 25 (1) Electronic publication which is accessible to the
- 26 <u>general public.</u>
- 27 (2) Issuance of invitations for bids to bidders on the
- 28 solicitation mailing list of the commission.
- 29 (3) Publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
- 30 Copies of requests for proposals shall be made available to

- 1 any interested person upon request to the advisory committee.
- 2 The commission may establish procedures for the distribution of
- 3 requests for proposals, including the imposition of a fee to
- 4 reimburse the commission for the costs of photocopying and
- 5 <u>mailing</u>.
- 6 (4) Issuance of invitations for bids to anyone who
- 7 <u>submitted a bid in the previous five years and was</u>
- 8 <u>unsuccessful.</u>
- 9 (5) Placement on the commission's Internet website.
- 10 (1) Receipt of proposals. -- Wildlife conservation
- 11 organizations shall submit their proposals to ensure that their
- 12 proposals are received prior to the time and date established
- 13 for receipt of the proposals. Proposals shall be submitted in
- 14 the format required by the request for proposals. Proposals
- 15 shall be opened so as to avoid disclosure of their contents to
- 16 <u>competing wildlife conservation organizations.</u>
- 17 (m) Evaluation. -- The relative importance of the evaluation
- 18 factors shall be fixed prior to opening the proposals.
- 19 (n) Selection of organization to conduct auction. -- The
- 20 responsible wildlife conservation organization whose proposal is
- 21 determined in writing to be the most advantageous to the
- 22 advisory committee, taking into consideration all evaluation
- 23 factors, shall be selected to conduct the auction.
- 24 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
